

Please find attached blue sheet and documentation for a Tactical Diversion Task Force Agreement with the United States Department of Justice, Drug Enforcement Administration and the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government. This agreement allows for one Lexington Division of Police Officer to be assigned to this task force for a period of not less than two years. During this period of assignment, the officer will be under the direct supervision and control of a DEA Supervisory Special Agent assigned to the Task Force.

Duties and/or activities performed by the Task Force Officer are as listed:

- a) Investigate, disrupt and dismantle individuals and/or organizations involved in diversion schemes (e.g. "doctor shopping", prescription forgery, and prevalent retail-level violators) of controlled pharmaceuticals and/or listed chemicals in the Kentucky area;
- b) Investigate, gather and report intelligence data relating to trafficking of controlled pharmaceuticals and/or listed chemicals; and
- c) Conduct undercover operations where appropriate and engage in other traditional methods of investigation in order that the Task Force's activities will result in effective prosecution before the courts of the United States and the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

TACTICAL DIVERSION TASK FORCE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE LEXINGTON-FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT AND THE DRUG ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATION AT LEXINGTON, KENTUCKY

This agreement is made this 1st day of June, 2010, between the United States Department of Justice, Drug Enforcement Administration (hereinafter "DEA"), and the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, on behalf of the Division of Police (hereinafter "LFUCG").

WHEREAS there is evidence that trafficking in controlled substance pharmaceuticals and/or listed chemicals exists in the area and that such illegal activity has a substantial and detrimental effect on the health and general welfare of the people of Kentucky, the parties hereto agree to the following:

- 1. The Lexington Tactical Diversion Task Force will perform the activities and duties described below:
- a. Investigate, disrupt and dismantle individuals and/or organizations involved in diversion schemes (e.g., "doctor shopping", prescription forgery, and prevalent retail-level violators) of controlled pharmaceuticals and/or listed chemicals in the Kentucky area;
- b. Investigate, gather and report intelligence data relating to trafficking of controlled pharmaceuticals and/or listed chemicals; and
- c. Conduct undercover operations where appropriate and engage in other traditional methods of investigation in order that the Task Force's activities will result in effective prosecution before the courts of the United States and the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
- 2. To accomplish the objectives of the Lexington Tactical Diversion Task Force, the LFUCG agrees to detail one (1) experienced officer to the Lexington Tactical Diversion Task Force for a period of not less than two years. During this period of assignment, the LFUCG officer will be under the direct supervision and control of a DEA Supervisory Special Agent assigned to the Task Force.
- 3. The LFUCG officer assigned to the Task Force shall adhere to DEA policies and procedures. Failure to adhere to DEA policies and procedures shall be grounds for dismissal from the Task Force.
- 4. The LFUCG officer assigned to the Task Force shall be deputized as a Task Force Officer of DEA pursuant to 21 U.S.C. 878.
- 5. To accomplish the objectives of the Lexington Tactical Diversion Task Force, DEA will assign Special Agents and Diversion Investigators to the Task Force. DEA will also, subject to the availability of annual Diversion Control Fee Account (DCFA) funds or any continuing resolution thereof, provide necessary funds and equipment to support the activities of the DEA Special Agents and LFUCG officers assigned to the Task Force. This support will include:

- office space, office supplies, travel funds, funds for the purchase of evidence and information, investigative equipment, training, and other support items, as available DCFA funds permit. Task Force officers must record their work hours via DEA's activity reporting system.
- 6. During the period of assignment to the Lexington Tactical Diversion Task Force, the LFUCG will be responsible for establishing the salary and benefits, including overtime, of the officers assigned to the Task Force, and for making all payments due them. DEA will, subject to availability of funds, reimburse the agency/department for overtime payments made by it to LFUCG officers assigned to the Lexington Tactical Diversion Task Force for overtime, up to a sum equivalent to 25 percent of the salary of a GS-12, step 1, (RUS) Federal employee (currently \$16,903.25), per officer.
- 7. In no event will the LFUCG charge any indirect cost rate to DEA for the administration or implementation of this agreement.
- 8. The LFUCG shall maintain on a current basis complete and accurate records and accounts of all obligations and expenditures of funds under this agreement in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and instructions provided by DEA to facilitate on-site inspection and auditing of such records and accounts.
- 9. The LFUCG shall permit and have readily available for examination and auditing by DEA, the United States Department of Justice, the Comptroller General of the United States, and any of their duly authorized agents and representatives, any and all records, documents, accounts, invoices, receipts or expenditures relating to this agreement. The LFUCG shall maintain all such reports and records until all audits and examinations are completed and resolved, or for a period of three (3) years after termination of this agreement, whichever is sooner.
- 10. The LFUCG shall comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended, and all requirements imposed by or pursuant to the regulations of the United States Department of Justice implementing those laws, 28 C.F.R. Part 42, Subparts C, F, G, H and I.
- 11. The LFUCG agrees that an authorized officer or employee will execute and return to DEA the attached OJP Form 4061/6, Certification Regarding Lobbying; Debarment, Suspension and Other Responsibility Matters; and Drug-Free Workplace Requirements. The LFUCG acknowledges that this agreement will not take effect and no Federal funds will be awarded to the LFUCG by DEA until the completed certification is received.
- 12. When issuing statements, press releases, requests for proposals, bid solicitations, and other documents describing projects or programs funded in whole or in part with Federal money, the LFUCG shall clearly state: (1) the percentage of the total cost of the program or project which will be financed with Federal money and (2) the dollar amount of Federal funds for the project or program.
- 13. The term of this agreement shall be from the date of signature by representatives of both parties until September 30, 2010. This agreement may be terminated by either party on thirty days' advance written notice. Billings for all outstanding obligations must be received by DEA within 90 days of the date of termination of this agreement. DEA will be responsible only for obligations incurred by LFUCG during the term of this agreement.

On June 12, 2008, (Ordinance # 125-2008), the Urban County Council approved acceptance of award from the Kentucky Office of Homeland Security of federal funds in the amount of \$311,584.50 for continuation of the Metropolitan Medical Response System (MMRS). This program provides funding and support to jurisdictions to develop plans, conduct training and exercises, and to acquire pharmaceuticals and equipment to achieve the capability necessary to respond to a mass casualty event. One of the MMRS program's priorities is to assist with the integration of first responder, medical treatment, public health and emergency management components of a community.

On December 8, 2010 (Resolution No. 799-2009), Council approved execution of an agreement with the Kentucky Office of Homeland Security extending the project through June 30, 2010.

The Kentucky Department of Homeland Security has now offered a modification to the agreement providing for an expiration date of December 31, 2010. No other changes are proposed.

I am requesting Urban County Council approval to enter into a lease agreement with Cooper Stofer, dba Lexington Audio Video Advantage (LAVA), for the space located at 124 North Broadway Street, aka the Broadway Shoppes. This space was formerly occupied by the Bluebird Beauty Salon, is approximately 1,130 sq. ft., and building fit-up by LFUCG and Tenant is required. An audio video business will be operated at the location with fit-up and ongoing maintenance responsibilities outlined within the lease agreement. This agreement will be for a period of sixty (60) months, expire on August 31, 2015, and an early termination penalty has been built into the terms of the agreement.

LFUCG will receive an initial rate of \$1,657.34 per month for use of this space, or, \$19,888.00 for the first 12 months of occupancy. During each year of the second through fourth of this Lease agreement the rental rate shall be adjusted upward 2% over the previous 12 month period. For the fifth and final year of the agreement a 2 ½% rate increase shall apply. The annual rate increase and monthly payments are defined within the agreement. The lease includes one (1) parking space @ no cost to the Tenant in the Victorian Square parking garage.

CARDINAL VALLEY

On February 8, 2007 (Ordinance # 28-2007), the Urban County Council authorized the acceptance of federal funds for the implementation of a flood hazard mitigation project in the Cardinal Valley area.

The Kentucky Division of Emergency Management has offered the LFUCG a modification to the agreement providing for an expiration date of December 30, 2010.

This project provides for the construction of a 7.2 acre detention basin on Vaughn's Branch just upstream from Versailles Road with the widening of approximately 1,000 linear feet of channel and installation of box culverts above the detention basin. The project also includes the widening of approximately 1,100 linear feet of channel and box culverts below the detention basin.

The source of federal funds is the Department of Homeland Security, Federal Emergency Management Agency, Hazard Mitigation Grant Program as authorized by the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act of 1988. Purpose of this project is to mitigate flooding problems in the Cardinal Valley area.

Budget & Finance Committee Summary June 29, 2010

Chair CM Stinnett called the meeting to order at 1:00 pm. All committee members present along with CMs Feigel and Martin.

1. Review and Discussion of FY 2010 Financials for May 2010 (monthly & YTD)-Rumpke

This PowerPoint presentation was done by William O'Mara, Director of Revenue. Revenue received updated information this morning and handed it out. It showed the unemployment rate was unchanged for May in Fayette County; the MSA picked up in Lexington-Fayette; and the state and national average increased.

Some CMs asked questions and made comments. CM Gorton asked about the franchise fee as it related to the unemployment rate. Mr. O'Mara stated that the franchise fee is determined by rate and usage; it is seasonal and they will have to look at the average temperature to see what the trend will be. Mrs. Mary Fister-Tucker, Director of Accounting, also assisted in the fielding of questions.

2. Discussion of Annual Financial Audit RFP-CM Stinnett

This presentation was done by CM Stinnett. CM Stinnett stated that the RFP committee decided to stay with the current auditor. CM Gorton asked why the committee decided to stay with the current auditor. CM Stinnett said there were several reasons-the price, they have an emphasis on IT, they have experience, and they are a local company, the partner that headed the audit last year was brought in from the Louisville office. CM James stated that the firm selected has multiple partners and this will allow for LFUCG to change the main contact partner, which is required by the SOCS guidelines, every five years as stated by Mrs. Fister-Tucker. CM James went on to say that based on statutory requirements, the firm selected did not offer a workforce sheet or a minority business or women-owned form; it is not required, but they didn't even offer; CM Stinnett said maybe legislation needs to be worked on for this.

CM Stinnett asked what topics were needed for the next meeting in August. It was suggested that the debt management policy and revision to the business occupational license be on the agenda. CM Martin stated that he would like to discuss the options for the administration and Council for the rainy day fund and CM Gorton stated that she would like for the ordinance to be reviewed.

CM James said that there needs to be something in place in order to understand the unemployment numbers.

A motion by CM Gorton to adjourn, seconded by CM Lane, passed without dissent.

Meeting adjourned at 1:47 pm.
