CSEPP_2007--On January 25, 2007 (Ordinance # 13-2007), the Urban County Council accepted award of federal funds from the Kentucky Department of Military Affairs, Division of Emergency Management in the amount of \$161,098 for the continuation of the Chemical Stockpile Emergency Preparedness Program (CSEPP) for Fiscal Year 2007, for the period of October 1, 2006 through June 30, 2008. On August 21, 2008 (Resolution No. 494-2008), Council authorized execution of an amendment extending the performance period through June 30, 2010.

CSEPP_2008--On November 15, 2007 (Ordinance # 257-2007), the Urban County Council accepted award of federal funds from the Kentucky Department of Military Affairs, Division of Emergency Management in the amount of \$125,320 for the continuation of the Chemical Stockpile Emergency Preparedness Program (CSEPP) for Fiscal Year 2008, for the period of October 1, 2007 through June 30, 2008. On August 21, 2008 (Resolution No. 494-2008), Council authorized execution of an amendment extending the performance period through June 30, 2010.

CSEPP_2009—On April 9, 2009 (Ordinance # 47-2009), the Urban County Council accepted award of federal funds from the Kentucky Department of Military Affairs, Division of Emergency Management in the amount of \$373,200 for the continuation of the Chemical Stockpile emergency Preparedness Program (CSEPP) for Fiscal Year 2009, for the period of October 1, 2008 through June 30, 2010.

CSEPP_2010—On May 6, 2010 (Ordinance# 84-2010), the Urban County Council accepted award of federal funds from the Kentucky Department of Military Affairs, Division of Emergency Management in the amount of \$595,600 for the continuation of the Chemical Stockpile emergency Preparedness Program (CSEPP) for Fiscal Year 2010, for the period of October 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010.

The source of federal funds is the Department of Homeland Security/Federal Emergency Management Agency. CSEPP funds are used to support emergency preparedness activities in a nine county area that surrounds the Blue Grass Army Depot in Richmond, the site of a stockpile of chemical weapons.

The Kentucky Department of Military Affairs, Division of Emergency Management has offered the LFUCG modifications to these agreements extending them as follows:

- CSEPP_2007—through December 31, 2010
- CSEPP_2008—through December 31, 2010
- CSEPP_2009—through September 30, 2010
- CSEPP_2010—through September 30, 2011

Change Order No. 1 to Contract with BCD, Inc. (FINAL)

The Division of Waste Management is requesting approval of Change Order No. 1 to the contract with BCD, Inc. for the LFUCG MRF Renovation Project to increase the contract amount by \$30,746.15. Some expenses for this project have been greater than expected, while others have been less. A full list of changes is attached. The overall net increase of \$30,746.15 amounts to a 7.3% increase on the original purchase order.

Of the items that have come in higher than expected, the largest expenses are for an added 70 feet of 5-feet high keystone wall (an extra \$12,456), extra excavation time/costs due to hitting a rock shelf (an extra \$7,296), additional concrete work with underground downspouts (an extra \$3,780), and additional push walls to protect the Tension Fabric Structure (TFS) (an extra \$4,125). Of the items coming in under budget, the greatest savings came from deleting concrete for the recycled glass area (a savings of \$6,308.55) and purchasing used (instead of new) Jersey barriers for the push wall base (a savings of \$3,000).

The original contract of \$419,500.01 was approved by Resolution No. 198-2010 on April 22, 2010. This change order, if approved, will increase the final contract amount to \$450,246.16. This project is funded by the Urban Services District Fund.

He said it makes sense to discuss a provision, not allowing former employees to deal with certain issues. He cited leaving government and working for a public utility as an example.

James asked how this might affect those employees, such as elected officials, appointed, etc. She asked if there might also be a state statue regarding *pre* employment.

Crosbie responded said she knew of four (4) cases where this has occurred and would be glad to discuss details with Blues. Crosbie stated she was comfortable with looking further into this and obtaining additional research.

James stated unless the committee disagreed, this issue would remain on the items referred to committee list, to be discussed in more detail at a later meeting.
