Ord. No. 11-2013-An Ordinance amending Section 21-5(2) of the Code of Ordinances, creating one (1) position of Skilled Trades Worker Sr., Grade 112N and abolishing one (1) position of Skilled Trades Worker, Grade 111N in the Div. of Community Corrections, appropriating funds pursuant to Schedule No. 35, effective upon passage of Council. Passed Feb. 12, 2013

Ord. No. 12-2013-An Ordinance amending certain of the Budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to reflect current requirements for municipal expenditures, and appropriating and re-appropriating funds, Schedule No. 34. Whereas, it is necessary and proper to amend the budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to reflect current requirements for municipal expenditures: Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained By the Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government: Section 1 - That certain of the Budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government be and hereby are amended to reflect current requirements for municipal expenditures, and that to effect such Amendments the following appropriations be and hereby are authorized and directed:)\$55,000 to the Unappropriated Fund Balance in the Full Urban Service District Fund from various accounts.)\$55,000 from the Unappropriated Fund Balance in the Sanitary Sewer Revenue and Construction Fund to various accounts.)Re-appropriations within the General Service District – General Fund; Sanitary Sewer Revenue and Operating Fund; and the various grant funds which do not result in changes to the Unappropriated Fund Balance of these funds. Section 2 - That the purposes of the Budget Amendments and the Accounts to or from which funds are herein appropriated, are detailed in Budget Schedule No. 34 attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
