No. 52-2013-An Ordinance amending certain of the Budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to reflect current requirements for municipal expenditures, and appropriating and re-appropriating funds, Schedule No. 51. Whereas, it is necessary and proper to amend the budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to reflect current requirements for municipal expenditures: Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained By the Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government: Section 1 - That certain of the Budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government be and hereby are amended to reflect current requirements for municipal expenditures, and that to effect such Amendments the following appropriations be and hereby are authorized and directed:)\$250,000 from the Unappropriated Fund Balance in the General Service District – General Fund to various accounts.) Re-appropriations within the General Service District – General Fund; Donation Fund; Municipal Aid Program Fund; and the various grant funds which do not result in changes to the Unappropriated Fund Balance of these funds. Section 2 - That the purposes of the Budget Amendments and the Accounts to or from which funds are herein appropriated, are detailed in Budget Schedule No. 51 attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Ord. No. 53-2013-An Ordinance amending Article 5-1(a) of the Zoning Ordinance to provide for right-of-entry and administrative warrants related to zoning enforcement. Passed May 23, 2013

Ord. No. 54-2013-An Ordinance, pursuant to Code of Ordinances Section 18-83 and Section 18-109, designating Lewis St. as a one-way street with angle parking and authorizing and directing the Div. of Traffic Engineering to install proper and appropriate signs and markings in accordance with the designation. Passed May 23, 2013
