**Ord. 113-2013**-An Ordinance amending Section 21-5(2) of the Code of Ordinances, abolishing one (1) position of Associate Traffic Engineer, Grade 115E, and creating one (1) position of Traffic Engineer, Grade 117E, and reclassifying the incumbent, (due to Engineering Licensure obtainment) in the Div. of Traffic Engineering, and appropriating funds pursuant to Schedule No. 14, effective retroactive to June 17, 2013. Passed Sept.26, 2013

**Ord. 114-2013**-An Ordinance amending Section 21-5(2) of the Code of Ordinances, abolishing one (1) position of Staff Assistant Sr., Grade 108N, and creating one (1) position of Information Systems Specialist, Grade 111N, both in the Div. of Parks and Recreation, and appropriating funds pursuant to Schedule No. 15, effective upon passage of Council. Passed Sept.26, 2013

**Ord. 115-2013**-An Ordinance amending certain of the Budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to reflect current requirements for municipal expenditures, and appropriating and re-appropriating funds, Schedule No. 12. Whereas, it is necessary and proper to amend the budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to reflect current requirements for municipal expenditures: Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained By The Council Of The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government: Section 1 - That certain of the Budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government be and hereby are amended to reflect current requirements for municipal expenditures, and that to effect such Amendments the following appropriations be and hereby are authorized and directed: ) \$305,237 from the Unappropriated Fund Balance in the General Services District – General Fund to various accounts. ) \$156,310 to the Unappropriated Fund Balance in the Full Urban Services District Fund from various accounts. ) \$31,600 from the Unappropriated Fund Balance in the PFC-Parks Projects Fund to various accounts. ) Re-appropriations within the Donation Fund; Full Urban Services District Fund; Water Quality Management Fund; and the various grant funds which do not result in changes to the Unappropriated Fund Balance of these funds. Section 2 - That the purposes of the Budget Amendments and the Accounts to or from which funds are herein appropriated, are detailed in Budget Schedule No. 12 attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Section 3 - That this Ordinance shall become effective on the date of its passage. Passed Sept.26, 2013

**Ord. 116-2013**-An Ordinance of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government making certain findings concerning and establishing a development area for Economic Development purposes within of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County to be known as the Summit Lexington Development Area; approving a local participation agreement among Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, the Department Finance of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, and Bayer Properties, LLC (the “developer”); establishing an incremental tax special fund for payment of approved public infrastructure costs and land preparation costs; designating the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government's Department of Finance as the agency responsible for oversight, administration, and implementation of the development area: and authorizing the Mayor and other Officials to take such other appropriate actions as are necessary or required in connection with the establishment of the development area. Passed Sept. 26, 2013

**ORD. 117-2013**-An Ordinance amending Subsections 16-16.2(c)(1),16-64(c)(1),

and 16-404(4)(a) of the Code Of Ordinances of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to provide for a penalty for unpaid bills after twenty (20) days. Section 1 - That Subsection 16-16.2(c)(1) of the Code of Ordinances be and hereby is amended to read as follows: Sec. 16-16.2. (c) All unpaid Landfill-Solid Waste Bills are subject to penalty and interest charges to be computed as follows: (1) Any unpaid Landfill-Solid Waste Disposal bill or a portion of any unpaid bill remaining unpaid for more than twenty (20) days from the date of billing may be assessed a penalty of ten (10) percent of the unpaid balance. Section 2 - That Subsection 16-64(c)(1) of the Code of Ordinances be and hereby is amended to read as follows: Sec. 16-64. (C) All unpaid Sanitary Sewer Bills are subject to a penalty and interest charge to be computed in the following manner: (1) Any Sanitary Sewer Service Bill or a portion of any unpaid Sewer Service Bill remaining unpaid for more than twenty (20) days from the date of billing may be assessed a penalty of ten (10) percent of the unpaid balance. Section 3 - That Subsection 16-404(4)(a) of the Code of Ordinances be and hereby is amended to read as follows: Sec. 16-404. (4) all unpaid Water Quality Management Bills are subject to penalty and interest charges to be computed in the following manner: (A) Any Water Quality Management Bill or a portion of any unpaid Water Quality Management Bill remaining unpaid for more than twenty (20) days from the date of billing may be assessed a penalty of ten (10) percent of the unpaid balance. Section 4 - if any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unlawful by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof. Passed Sept.26, 2013
