**Ord. 82-2014**-An Ordinance amending Section 21-5(2) of the Code of Ordinances, creating one (1) position of Municipal Engineer Sr., Grade 119E, in the Div. of Engineering; two (2) positions of Human Resources Analyst, Grade 115E, in the Div. of Human Resources; two (2) positions of Public Safety Answering Point Manager, Grade 117E, and three (3) positions of Telecommunicator, Grade 111N, in the Div. of Emergency Management/E911; one (1) position of Skilled Trades Worker Sr., Grade 112N, and fifteen (15) positions of Community Corrections Officer, Grade 110N, in the Div. of Community Corrections; one (1) position of Electronic Technician, Grade 111N, in the Div. of Police; one (1) position of Microcomputer Support Specialist, Grade 113N, in the Div. of Fire and Emergency Services; one (1) position of Social Worker, Grade 111E, and one (1) position of Custodial Worker, Grade 102N, in the Div. of Family Services; one (1) position of Grants Manager, Grade 117E, and one (1) position of Administrative Specialist Sr., Grade 112N, in the Div. of Grants and Special Programs; and abolishing two (2) positions of Telecommunicator Supervisor, Grade 116E, in the Div. of Emergency Management/E911; amending Section 23-5(2) creating fifteen (15) positions of Police Officer, Grade 311N, in the Div. of Police; and one (1) position of Fire Major, Grade 318E, in the Div. of Fire; and amending section 22-5(2) creating one (1) position of Eligibility Counselor, Grade 110E, in the Div. of Adult Services, all effective July 1, 2014. **Ord. 83-2014**-An Ordinance amending Section 21-5(2) of the Code of Ordinances, abolishing one (1) position of Associate Traffic Engineer, Grade 115E, and creating One (1) position of Traffic Engineer, Grade 117E, and reclassifying the incumbent, (due to engineering licensure obtainment) in the Div. of Traffic Engineering, effective June 2, 2014. Passed July 8, 2014

**Ord. 84-2014**-An Ordinance amending certain of the Budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to reflect current requirements for municipal expenditures, and appropriating and re-appropriating funds, FY 2014 Schedule No. 71. Whereas, it is necessary and proper to amend the budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to reflect current requirements for municipal expenditures: Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained By the Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government: Section 1 - That certain of the Budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government be and hereby are amended to reflect current requirements for municipal expenditures, and that to effect such Amendments the following appropriations be and hereby are authorized and directed: ) \$143,779.34 from the Unappropriated Fund Balance in the General Services District Fund to various accounts. ) \$88,053,247 from the Unappropriated Fund Balance in the Sanitary Sewer Revenue and Operating Fund to various accounts. ) \$88,053,247 to the Unappropriated Fund Balance in the Sanitary Sewer Construction Fund from various accounts. ) \$2,698,058 from the Unappropriated Fund Balance in the Water Quality Management Fund to various accounts. ) \$2,698,058 to the Unappropriated Fund Balance in the Water Quality Construction Fund from various accounts. ) Re-appropriations within the Prisoners' Account Fund; Police and Fire Retirement Fund; and Health Insurance Fund which do not result in changes to the Unappropriated Fund Balance of these funds. Section 2 - That the purposes of the Budget Amendments and the Accounts to or from which funds are herein appropriated, are detailed in FY 2014 Budget Schedule No. 71 attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

Section 3 - That this Ordinance shall become effective on the date of its passage.

**Ord. 85-2014**-An Ordinance amending certain of the Budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to reflect current requirements for municipal expenditures, and appropriating and re-appropriating funds, FY 2015 Schedule No. 1. Whereas, it is necessary and proper to amend the budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to reflect current requirements for municipal expenditures: Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained By The Council Of The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government: Section 1 - That certain of the Budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government be and hereby are amended to reflect current requirements for municipal expenditures, and that to effect such Amendments the following appropriations be and hereby are authorized and directed: ) \$84,995 to the Unappropriated Fund Balance in the General Services District Fund from various accounts. ) \$1,723,800 from the Unappropriated Fund Balance in the Enhanced 911 Fund to various accounts. ) \$511,000 from the Unappropriated Fund Balance in the Central Kentucky 911 Fund to various accounts. ) Re-appropriations within the Municipal Aid Program Fund; 2015 Bond Fund; Water Quality Management Fund; and the various grant funds which do not result in changes to the Unappropriated Fund Balance of these funds. Section 2 - That the purposes of the Budget Amendments and the Accounts to or from which funds are herein appropriated, are detailed in Budget Schedule No. 1 attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Section 3 - That this Ordinance shall become effective on the date of its passage. Passed July 8, 2014

**Ord. 86-2014**-An Ordinance amending Section 22-5(2) of the Code of Ordinances, creating one (1) position of Affordable Housing Manager, Grade 120E in the Dept. of Planning, Preservation and Development; effective upon date of passage, for a term of four years, appropriating funds pursuant to Schedule No. 2. Passed July 8, 2014

**Ord. 87-2014**-An Ordinance amending Section 21-5(2) of the Code of Ordinances, abolishing one (1) position of Staff Assistant, Grade 107N, in the Div. of Revenue; and amending Section 22-5(2) of the Code of Ordinances, abolishing one (1) position of Senior Citizens Center Manager, Grade 113N, in the Dept. of Social Services; one (1) position of Early Childhood Violence Prevention Manager Pt, Grade 117E; one (1) position of Family Services Center Manager, Grade 116E; two (2) positions of Social Worker Sr.; and one (1) position of Teacher/Counselor, Grade 111E, all in the Div. of Family Services, effective upon passage of Council.
