

The following Ordinances were signed by Mayor Jim Gray, attested by Council Clerk Meredith Nelson and published on June 26, 2014-1t

Ord. 67-2014-On Ordinance changing the zone from a High Density Apartment (R-4) zone to a Neighborhood Business (B-1) zone, for 0.441 net (0.515 gross) acres for property located at 508 West Second St., including dimensional variances (Collins-Wathen Properties, LLC; Council District 2). Passed June 19, 2014

Ord. 68-2014-An Ordinance changing the zone from a Single Family Residential (R-1D) zone to a High Density Apartment (R-4) zone, for 0.9 net (1.1 gross) acres for property located at 201 & 205 Burley Ave.; 1107, 1109 & 1111 Stillwell Ave., including dimensional variances (Burley Partners, LLC; Council District 3). Passed June 19, 2014

Ord. 69-2014-An Ordinance amending Sections 2-250, 2-251, 2-253 and 2-256 of the Code of Ordinances, relating to the Domestic Violence Prevention Board, to: include a Mission Statement for the Board; update the types of domestic violence to be the focus of the board; include a definition for "violence" and "abuse"; include a list of primary objectives; update the membership of the board; provide that the members of the board shall elect officers, that elected officers shall serve a four-year term and may not serve consecutive terms, and that the Commissioner of Social Services shall serve as the Treasurer; and to update the duties of the board. Passed June 19, 2014

Ord. 70-2014-An Ordinance amending certain of the Budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to reflect current requirements in the Div. of Traffic Engineering for funds in the amount of \$1,900 from Neighborhood Development Funds for traffic improvements at Glendover Rd and Valley Rd, and appropriating and re-appropriating funds, Schedule No. 69. Whereas, it is necessary and proper to amend the budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to reflect current requirements in the Div. of Traffic Engineering for funds in the amount of \$1,900 from Neighborhood Development Funds for the traffic improvements at Glendover Rd and Valley Rd; Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained By the Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government: Section 1 - That certain of the Budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government be and hereby are amended to reflect current requirements in the Div. of Traffic Engineering for funds in the amount of \$1,900 from Neighborhood Development Funds for the traffic improvements at Glendover Rd and Valley Rd and that to effect such Amendments the following appropriations be and hereby are authorized and directed:)Re-appropriations within the General Services District – General Fund that do not result in changes to the Unappropriated Fund Balance of this respective fund. Section 2 - That the purposes of the Budget Amendments and the Accounts to or from which funds are herein appropriated, are detailed in Schedule No. 69, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Section 3 - That this Ordinance shall become effective on the date of its passage. Passed June 19, 2014

Ord. 71-2014-Ordinance of the Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government authorizing and approving the Execution and Delivery of a Fourth Supplemental Lease Agreement between the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Airport Board as the Lessor and the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government as the Lessee in connection with the Issuance of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Airport Board General Airport Revenue Obligation, 2014

Series A (Revolving Credit Note) (Lexington- Fayette Urban County Government General Obligation), evidencing a line of Credit Agreement by and between the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Airport Board and Branch Banking and Trust Company, in a maximum Aggregate Principal amount not to exceed \$10,000,000, for the purpose of providing Interim Financing for certain Airport Facilities at the Blue Grass Airport in Fayette County, Kentucky. Passed June 19, 2014

Ord. 72-2014-An Ordinance amending certain of the Budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to reflect current requirements for Municipal Expenditures, and appropriating and re-appropriating Funds, Schedule No. 66. Whereas, it is necessary and proper to amend the budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to reflect current requirements for municipal expenditures: Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained By the Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government: Section 1 - That certain of the Budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government be and hereby are amended to reflect current requirements for municipal expenditures, and that to effect such Amendments the following appropriations be and hereby are authorized and directed:) \$640,000 from the Unappropriated Fund Balance in the Sanitary Sewer Revenue and Operating Fund to various accounts.)\$94,000 from the Unappropriated Fund Balance in the Water Quality Management Fund to various accounts.) \$70,000 from the Unappropriated Fund Balance in the Landfill Fund to various accounts.)Re-appropriations within the General Service District Fund; Donations Fund; FY 2015 Bond Projects Fund; Police and Fire Retirement Fund; and the various grant funds which do not result in changes to the Unappropriated Fund Balance of these funds. Section 2 - That the purposes of the Budget Amendments and the Accounts to or from which funds are herein appropriated, are detailed in Budget Schedule No. 66 attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Section 3 - That this Ordinance shall become effective on the date of its passage. Passed June 19, 2014

Ord. 73-2014-An Ordinance amending Certain of the Budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to reflect current requirements for funds in the amount of \$1,700 from Neighborhood Development Funds in the Department of Social Services for the Senior Intern Program, and appropriating and re-appropriating Funds, Schedule No. 70. Whereas, it is necessary and proper to amend the budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to reflect current requirements for funds in the amount of \$1,700 from Neighborhood Development Funds in the Dept. of Social Services for the Senior Intern Program: Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained by the Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government: Section 1 - That certain of the Budgets of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government be and hereby are amended to reflect current requirements for funds in the amount of \$1,700 from Neighborhood Development Funds in the Dept. of Social Services for the Senior Intern Program and that to effect such Amendments the following appropriations be and hereby are authorized and directed:) Re-appropriations within the General Services District – General Fund and the Donation Fund which do not result in changes to the Unappropriated Fund Balance of these funds. Section 2 - That the purposes of the Budget Amendments and the Accounts to or from which funds are herein appropriated, are detailed in Schedule No. 70, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Section 3 - That this Ordinance shall become effective on the date of its passage. Passed June 19, 2014

Ord. 74-2014- An Ordinance appropriating the Revenues, Expenditures/Expenses and Interfund Transfers for the General Services District Fund, the Tenant Relocation Fund, the Full Urban Services Districts Fund, the Police Confiscated Federal Fund, the Police Confiscated State Fund, the Public Safety Fund, the Municipal Aid Program Fund, the County Aid Program Fund, the Mineral Severance Fund, the Coal Severance Fund, the Miscellaneous Special Revenue Fund, the Police Confiscated – Treasury Fund, the FY 2015 Bond Projects Funds, the Sanitary Sewer Revenue and Operating Fund, the Sanitary Sewer Construction Fund, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government Public Facilities Corporation General Fund, The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government Public Facilities Corporation Parks Projects Fund, the Water Quality Management Fund, the Water Quality Management Construction Fund, the Landfill Fund, the Right of Way Program Fund, the Extended School Program Fund, the Prisoners' Account Fund, the Enhanced 911 Fund, the Central Kentucky 911 Fund, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government Public Library Corporation Fund, the City Employees' Pension Fund, the Police and Fire Retirement Fund of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, the Medical Insurance Fund, the Property and Casualty Claims Fund, and the Reallocation of Bond Project Funds, on a Divisional Level by Four (4) Control Levels, for the Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2015, for the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government and its Agencies and Instrumentalities; approving and adopting the Capital Improvement Program for Fiscal Years (FY) 2015 through (FY) 2020, as a portion of the Fiscal Year (Fy) 2015 Annual Capital Improvements Budget; and approving Funding for the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Tourist and Convention Commission from the Transient Room Tax, said Funding to equal 99 1/2% of the Revenue from the Tax. Whereas, pursuant to Section 8.03 of the Charter of the Urban County Government the Mayor has also presented a detailed summary of the capital improvements program plan for the next five fiscal years, as a part of the annual capital improvements budgets; Whereas, public hearings on the budgets have been held; Whereas, Ordinance No. 129-2005 was adopted June 9, 2005 setting forth the procedures for budget adoption; Whereas, the Urban County Council has thoroughly reviewed the proposed budgets and has made certain amendments thereto, which amendments are reflected in the Mayor's Proposed Budget as amended by the Urban County Council, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit "A"; WHEREAS, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Tourist and Convention Commission has pursuant to KRS 91A.390(1) submitted its budget, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit "B", to the Urban County Council and requested funding for the 12 months fiscal year ending June 30, 2015. Now, Therefore, on the basis of the said budgets and in accordance with the provisions thereof, Be It Ordained By the Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government: Section 1 - That the Revenues, Interfund Transfers, and Expenditures/Expenses for the General Services District Fund, the Tenant Relocation Fund, the Full Urban Services Districts Fund, the Police Confiscated Federal Fund, the Police Confiscated State Fund, the Public Safety Fund, the Municipal Aid Program Fund, the County Aid Program Fund, the Mineral Severance Fund, the Coal Severance Fund, the Miscellaneous Special Revenue Fund, the Police Confiscated – Treasury Fund, the FY 2015 Bond Projects Fund, the Sanitary Sewer Revenue and Operating Fund, the Sanitary Sewer Construction Fund, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government Public Facilities Corporation General Fund, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government Public Facilities

Corporation Parks Projects Fund, the Water Quality Management Fund, the Water Quality Management Construction Fund, the Landfill Fund, the Right Of Way Program Fund, the Extended School Program Fund, the Prisoners' Account Fund, the Enhanced 911 Fund, the Central Kentucky 911 Fund, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government Public Library Corporation Fund, the City Employees' Pension Fund, the Police And Fire Retirement Fund of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, the Medical Insurance Fund, the Property and Casualty Claims Fund, and the reallocation of Bond Project Funds, on a divisional level by four (4) control levels, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, for Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government and its agencies and instrumentalities, are hereby allotted and reappropriated. Section 2 - Pursuant to Sections 8.03 and 8.05 of the Charter of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, the "Mayor's Proposed Capital Improvement Program", FY 2015-2020, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, is hereby accepted, approved and adopted as a portion of the annual capital improvements budget of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government for fiscal year 2015; provided, however, the capital improvements program for fiscal year 2016 through fiscal year 2020, adopted herein, shall be used as a planning device and not as a binding commitment for future capital improvement programs of the Urban County Government. Section 3 - That pursuant to KRS 91A.390(1), the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Tourist and Convention Commission shall receive 99 1/2% of the revenue received from the 4% transient room tax imposed by Section 2-172(a) of the Code of Ordinances. the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government shall retain 1/2% of said revenue to offset the cost of collecting the same. Section 4 - That the preamble set forth following the title to this Ordinance is incorporated herein as if set out in full. Section 5 - That this Ordinance shall become effective on the date of its passage. Passed June 19, 2014
