# **BUSINESS SPOTLIGHT: ATHENIAN GRILL**

Athenian Grill has experienced phenomenal growth in the last two years. Through it all, the restaurant has honored its commitment to being a sustainable enterprise.

The restaurant started as one of Lexington's food carts and quickly transitioned into a brick and mortar location at 313 South Ashland Avenue.

Owner Ilias Pappas reached out to Matthew Brooks of Alt32 Architecture & Design to help renovate the space. "Alt32 developed a plan in the early stages to save every piece of wood and material we took down during demolition." Pappas said, "When you walk into our place, you see the main counter built completely from wood from the original structure. The wall upstairs is also built and decorated with reclaimed wood from the ceiling."

Pappas ensured that Athenian Grill's sustainable efforts didn't end with renovations. The restaurant uses recyclable and compostable containers and plates; recycling bins are made available for the guests to use; the kitchen recycles and composts;

and the thermostat is turned down at the end of each day. In addition, many of Athenian Grill's ingredients are locally sourced.

A second location, also renovated with the help of Alt32, opened in May 2015. The AC units were replaced to be more efficient, and new equipment was purchased with the highest energy ratings in mind. The lighting was upgraded to LED fixtures. Sustainable operation practices, like recycling and composting, have carried over to the new location as well.

With a dedicated owner like Pappas at the helm, you can be sure Athenian Grill's sustainability efforts will continue to grow.

## **OUR EMPLOYEES: TRAINING FOR SAFETY**

They come down your street every week. They are tall - almost 12 feet - and long - around 28 feet - and are a nightmare to back up. What are they? Lexington's waste disposal trucks.

Employees of the city's Division of Waste
Management drive these huge vehicles through
our streets every day, in all weather conditions,
collecting your recyclables, yard waste and landfill
waste.

The task isn't easy. Ask any driver, especially a new one like Aaron Dishman. He is currently going through six weeks of driver training. Dishman and the other five drivers in his class are among the city's 120 drivers.

Lesa Spillman, a resource recovery operator, is Waste Management's lead trainer. She has been with the division for five years, starting out as a driver. Though she still sometimes drives, Spillman has spent most of the past three-and-a-half years training new drivers, public service workers who work off of the back of trucks and

doing refresher training for experienced drivers.

The driver course training includes backing up, parallel parking, and handling tight situations. Dishman says Spillman's course is tough. "You've got to pay attention and keep focused on what you are doing."

Asked what the toughest part of the course was, Dishman said: "They all are, but backing up into an alley is the hardest."

# TRANSFER STATION: NEW NAME, SAME SERVICE

The city's Transfer Station recently underwent a name change. The new name, Bluegrass Regional Transfer Station, reflects a recent change in management.

The name may be different, but the facility, located at 1505 Old Frankfort Pike, is still where citizens can drop off items to be taken to the landfill.

Residents may use the Transfer Station facility
