Lexington-Deauville Student Exchange

Fourteen students from Lexington visited Deauville, France in June for the Lexington - Deauville High School Student Exchange Program. The students stayed with host families for three weeks. Fourteen French students returned to Lexington in July to stay with host families for a three week period. Participating in the exchange from Lexington were: Nina Rvan from Lexington Catholic; Collier King from Bryan Station; Sara Talwalkar and Katherine Rintamaa from Dunbar; Rachel Sames from George Rogers Clark; Quinn Andrews and Sabrina Lozada from Henry Clay; Peter Briggs from Trinity Christian Academy; Abby Wrightson, Ashton Brown, Grayson Ward, Josh Dhir and Sarah Bowen from Lafavette; and Elise Partain from Tates Creek. The Lexington Students enjoyed seeing many sights in France, including a trip to the American Cemetery in Normandy, Mont St. Michel, and a visit to Paris. In



Lexington, students visited Memorial Coliseum and Rupp Arena, met Mayor Jim Gray, participated in many activities as a group as well as with their host families, and toured the Lexington and Bluegrass Region. The program is designed to provide students an opportunity to live in France to improve their French speaking skills while experiencing the culture, as well as provide the opportunity for French students to come to Lexington.

Lexington-County Kildare Student Exchange



Students were able to meet American Ambassador to Ireland, Kevin O'Malley, during their trip to County Kildare.

Ten students from Lexington visited County Kildare in July for a ten day stay. Students participating in the exchange were: Strohmann Breeding, Drew Reynolds, Erin Schickel, Garrett Amato, and Lily Iler from Lexington Catholic; Calbi Brewer and Karina Pezzi from Sayre, Avery Gray and Marissa Jones from Henry Clay; and Evan Bunch from Lafayette. Sarah Martin, Assistant Director of the Lexington Sister Cities Program, accompanied the students to County Kildare. During their stay in Ireland, students were able to visit Dublin, tour and visit the University of Maynooth, see many Irish castles, attend a rugby game, and participate in other activities. They were also able to experience every day Irish culture and life. Ten students from County Kildare, as well as Kildare Twinning Committee secretary Marjorie Moore, returned to Lexington to stay with host families. While in Lexington, some of the activities included visiting the Kentucky Horse Park, WKYT TV Station, Memorial Coliseum and Rupp Arena, and meeting Lexington Mayor Jim Gray.

Lexington-Shinhidaka Student Exchange

In March, nine students and three chaperones from Shinhidaka visited Lexington on a five day stay. The group toured the Kentucky Horse Park, McConnell Springs, the State Capitol, the Lexington Library, Fire Department, and Memorial Coliseum and met Lexington Mayor Jim Gray. Additionally, the students and chaperones toured the Locust Trace AgriScience School in Lexington to continue discussions about an exchange program with students from the Agriculture School in Shinhidaka. In June, nine students from Lexington visited Shinhidaka, located on the island of Hokkaido in Japan. Participating students included: Jack May from Henry Clay: Stephanie Ramsey from Sayre; Gavin Lemond, Lauren Burgess and Maggie Thomas from Lafayette; Karishma Srinivasan from Bryan Station; Olivia Klee from Winburn Middle School; and Griffin Gensheimer and Amanda Harris from Tates Creek. Crystal Dean, a math teacher at Locust Trace AgriScience School, accompanied the students on their trip. The group stayed with host families and visited a horse farm, the Shizunai



Agricultural High School, the Ainu Museum, and many other sites around Shinhidaka.



27th Annual Young Artist Competition

In February, Lexington Sister Cities participated in the 27th year of the Sister Cities International Young Artist Competition. A reception, sponsored by Central Bank, was held to announce the winners for first, second, third place and honorable mention; along with the winning art teacher, Jason Sturgill, of Lafayette. This year's contest included 45 entries from 6 schools. Quin Yessin from Lafayette was awarded first place for his piece based on the theme "Connecting Communities through Peace and Prosperity". Quinn Maynard from Lafayette was awarded second place; Samantha Skinner from Bryan Station received third place; and Kara Bethel from Lafayette received honorable mention. The first place winner received \$250, second place received \$150; third place was awarded \$100; and honorable mentioned received \$50. All entries to the contest were displayed from February 6th-27th at the Central Bank Gallery. Quin Yessin's artwork was entered into the Sister Cities International Competition. His artwork was displayed at the 2015 international conference in Minneapolis, MN. The International competition was open to high school students in all US Sister Cities and their Sister City affiliates throughout the world.

Deauville-Scapa Student Video Conference

In March, two 5th grade classes from SCAPA in Lexington and two 4th and 5th grade classes from Ecole Fracasse in Deauville were able to interact through a video conference to learn more about daily activities and hobbies of an American and French student. Mr. Lindsey and Ms. Klein's classes were led by Lexington French teacher Bonnie Bachmeyer, and the Deauville class was led by English teacher Ivan Rouault. The students prepared introductions, asked questions about their likes, interests and hobbies in Deauville and Lexington, and sang songs together. This year, students also participated in "challenges" given out by each class. Lexington students were challenged to learn the French alphabet and make a living French flag. French students were challenged to learn facts about the Bluegrass Region, and the name of a Derby winner and the year the horse won.

Cassidy-County Kildare Student Video Conference



In December, a second grade class from Cassidy Elementary in Lexington and a second year class at Holy Child School in Naas, County Kildare, Ireland, participated in a Skype Exchange. Ms. Meneghetti's class in Lexington and Ms. Lacey's class in County Kildare were able to share their

studies on different holidays and how they are celebrated. Students were also able to ask questions about holiday traditions and customs in Lexington and in County Kildare.

University of Kentucky/University of Caen Scholarship Exchange

Wesley Hammond, from the University of Kentucky, received the fall 2015 scholarship to the University of Caen. Wesley is from Mt. Sterling, KY and is a Theatre major with a minor in French.

Lauren Bix, a sophomore at the University of Kentucky, received the spring 2016 scholarship to the University of Caen. Lauren is from Lexington, KY and participated in the Lexington-Deauville Student Exchange Program while in high school. She is a French major with a German minor.

This scholarship is available to undergraduate and graduate students who have taken at least three years of college-level French.

Deauville Teaching Assistantship

Rachael Walters from Western Kentucky University and Michelle Fulton from the University of Kentucky were awarded the 2015-2016 teaching assistantship positions in Deauville. Michelle was a vocal performance major and French minor as an undergrad, and a French major as a graduate student. Michelle is from Louisville, KY. Rachael was a French and Spanish major with an education minor from Western Kentucky University.
