Cheapside Street is a one-way, one block street between West Short Street and West Main Street and located west of the Old Courthouse. Residents and merchants on Cheapside have requested a permanent closure for a better use of the area to the adjoining lawn of the Old Courthouse for public gatherings and events. A trial seasonal restriction of automobile traffic will be conducted for warmweather months. Bollards would be used at both ends of the street to restrict automobile traffic but will allow for direct bike and pedestrian access. The temporary closure will affect eight (8) parking meters supported by the Parking Authority. During the cold-weather season, the bollards would be removed to allow vehicle traffic to resume. Mayor Newberry applauded Commissioner Don Kelly's service to LFUCG and extend well wishes for his retirement effective, August 15, 2008.

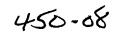
Mayor Newberry referred to the Management Partners Report advising the Council there would be a summary of recommendation forthcoming.

The Kentucky Justice Cabinet has awarded the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government a grant for continuation of the Street Sales Drug Enforcement project. Source of funds is the U.S. Department of Justice, Edward Bryne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program.

The Street Sales Enforcement project includes funds to offset the cost of the "Fast Track" prosecution program and the Major Violator (Repeat Offender) prosecution program in the Commonwealth Attorney's Office, as part of a drug task force. Funds are used to support one full-time assistant prosecutor for a one-year period.

The total cost of this element of the project is \$49,331. Federal funds are in the amount of \$36,998. The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government's general fund provides \$12,333 to the project. Budget amendment is in process providing funding for the project as follows:

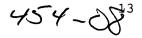

The software license agreement is fully budgeted. Budgetary impact for FY09 will be \$91,500.00.

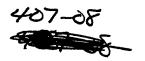

Trial Seasonal Restriction of Cheapside Street

LFUCG has received a request from the property owners and merchants of Cheapside Street to permanently restrict automobile traffic on the street, in the effort to better utilize the area and the adjoining lawn of the Old Courthouse for various public gatherings and events. Rather than a permanent restriction, I think it more prudent to conduct a trial seasonal restriction for the warmweather months, and then make an assessment afterward as to the positive / negative impacts to the community. I offer the following reasons in support of this proposal.

The Downtown Lexington Corporation and Downtown Development Authority are both highly supportive, as they have programmed regular warm-weather events in this location for several years, and understand how well it naturally functions as an outdoor community gathering site. As we approach 2010, it in intended to provide such areas in our downtown for the attendees of the world equestrian games to socialize and enjoy community festivities, and this trial period would give a greater sense of what will work for that and other future events.

Cheapside Street is a one way street just west of the Old Courthouse, only one block in length, running between West Short Street and West Main Street. An aerial photo is attached for reference. Automobile traffic on the street is minimal and a restriction would not pose undue burden on the driving public, as this same block can be traversed by either Mill Street or Upper Street, only one block in either direction from Cheapside Street. The only real impact to drivers would be the loss of 8 metered parking spaces, which is supported by the Parking Authority.

The automobile restriction would be accomplished by the installation of temporary bollards at either end of the street, which would still allow for direct bike and pedestrian access. No other physical construction would be undertaken, and automobile use would be restored during the cold weather season by removing the bollards. I propose that the typical automobile restriction period

would be April 15-November 1. Since we are past the April 15 date, I propose that the trial begin immediately this summer for the remaining warm weather season and extend until November 1, 2008. The impact of the closure would be evaluated at that time by the appropriate mechanism, and a decision made as to whether to continue the temporary closure in future years.

The appropriate divisions of government and the utility companies have reviewed and consented to the temporary restriction, subject to protecting access to their existing facilities in the area.

This is a proposed trial restriction of automobile traffic only, and no right-of-way is being closed or permanently barricaded – the street will be restored to full use at the end of the trial period. However, we have followed the same review process required by street closure or barricading procedures to evaluate the idea prior to making this recommendation.

Based on the support expressed by the adjacent property owners and merchants, and those who organize public events for the community, I request Council authorization of the trial automobile restriction as presented and execution of any related documents. Please address any questions to me in advance or at the Council Work Session when this matter is presented. Thank you.
