Historical and Statutory Notes

Note: 1995 2nd ex s, c 4, § 5, eff. 1-27-95, reads: Whereas, it appears that some officers mentioned in Section 103 of the Constitution of Kentucky have not secured bond as required by the statutes and are in jeopardy of removal from office if the situation is not corrected, an emergency is declared to

exist, and this Act shall become effective upon its passage and approval by the Governor and its provisions, except for the fine increase in KRS 62.050, shall be deemed retroactive to November 1, 1991.

62.055 Bonds of county clerks; minimum; record

- (1) Every county clerk, before entering on the duties of his office, shall execute bond to the Commonwealth, with corporate surety authorized and qualified to become surety on bonds in this state. Any county clerk holding office as of January 1, 1978, who has not executed bond as provided herein shall do so within thirty (30) days from February 9, 1978.
- (2) In counties containing a consolidated local government or a city of the first class, the amount of the county clerk's bond shall be at least five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000). In counties containing a city of the second class but not containing consolidated local governments and in counties containing an urban-county form of government, the amount of county clerk's bond shall be at least four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000). In counties containing a city of the third class but not a city of the first or second class, a consolidated local government, or an urban-county form of government, the amount of the county clerk's bond shall be at least one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000). In counties containing a city of the fourth or fifth class, but not a city of the first, second, or third class, a consolidated local government, or an urban-county form of government, the amount of the county clerk's bond shall be at least seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000). In counties containing a city of the sixth class, but not a city of the first, second, third, fourth, or fifth class, a consolidated local government, or an urban-county form of government, the amount of the county clerk's bond shall be at least fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000).
- (3) The bond of the county clerk shall be examined and approved by the fiscal court, which shall record the approval in its minutes. The fiscal court shall record the bond in the county clerk's records and a copy of the bond shall be transmitted within one (1) month to the Department of Revenue, where it shall be recorded and preserved. Except in those counties where the fees of the county clerk are paid into the State Treasury, the premium on the county clerk's bond shall be paid by the county.
- (4) Where circumstances in a particular county indicate that the amount of the bond may not be sufficient, the Department of Revenue may request the fiscal court to increase the bond as provided in KRS 62.060. The fiscal court shall then require a bond of sufficient amount to safeguard the Commonwealth.

Sec. 22-55.1. Local constitutional officers.

(1) Every local constitutional officer listed below shall execute a bond for the faithful performance of the duties of his office in the amount specified below:

County judge/executive . . . \$ 10,000

County clerk . . . 400,000

Sheriff (KRS 70.020) . . . 1,000.000

Sheriff (KRS 134.250) . . . 5,000,000

County surveyor ... 10,000

Coroner . . . 10,000

Deputy coroners . . . 10,000

Constables ... 10,000

- (2) Each local constitutional officer listed in subsection (1) of this section who is in office on January 1, 1998, shall have presented his bond with sureties to the division of risk management for approval by the urban county council prior to that date. Each person elected to a local constitutional office listed in subsection (1) of this section after that date shall present his bond with sureties to the division of risk management for approval by the urban county council before the day the term of office towhich he has been elected begins. Each person appointed to a local constitutional office listed in subsection (1) of this section after that date shall present his bond with sureties to the division of risk management for approval by the urban county council within thirty (30) days after he receives notice of his appointment.
- (3) Whenever the urban county council approves a bond with sureties pursuant to this section, the clerk of the urban county council shall record the approval of the bonds and sureties in the council's minutes.
- (4) The division of risk management shall record bonds approved pursuant to this section in the Fayette County clerk's records.
- (5) The division of risk management shall reimburse the premiums on the bonds of the local constitutional officers approved pursuant to this section from urban county government funds appropriated by the urban county council for that purpose, if a claim is made with a supporting affidavit by a local constitutional officer. However, pursuant to KRS 62.155, the premium on the sheriff's KRS 70.020 bond shall be paid or reimbursed by the Commonwealth of Kentucky and not by the division of risk management.
- (6) The KRS 70.020 bond of the sheriff shall be renewed annually and the bond of each constable shall be renewed biennially. All other bonds of the local constitutional officers listed in subsection (1) of this section shall be renewed for the term of any person elected or appointed to that office. However, the urban county council may at any time authorized by law require additional sureties of any local constitutional officers listed in subsection (1) of this section.

A RESOLUTION OF THE LEXINGTON-FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT AUTHORIZING THE ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS AND THE DISTRIBUTION OF A PRELIMINARY OFFICIAL STATEMENT FOR THE PURCHASE OF THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF ITS \$70,000,000 TAXABLE GENERAL OBLIGATION PENSION FUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2009B (WHICH AMOUNT MAY BE INCREASED OR DECREASED BY AN AMOUNT OF UP TO TEN PERCENT (10%))

WHEREAS, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government has previously determined, pursuant to actuarial reports prepared for the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, that unfunded liabilities to the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government's Policemen's and Firefighter's Pension Fund (the "Pension Fund") exist and that there is a need to fund such unfunded liabilities (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government has determined to proceed with the advertisement of bids for the purchase of its Taxable General Obligation Pension Funding Bonds, Series 2009B in the principal amount of \$70,000,000 (which amount may be increased or decreased by an amount of up to ten percent (10%)) (the "Series 2009B Bonds"), in order to provide funds to (i) fund a portion of such unfunded liabilities to the Pension Fund and (ii) pay the costs of issuing the Series 2009B Bonds.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE URBAN COUNTY COUNCIL
OF THE LEXINGTON-FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT (THE "URBAN
COUNTY COUNCIL"):

SECTION 1. The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, an urban county government and political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, shall issue its \$70,000,000 Taxable General Obligation Pension Funding Bonds, Series 2009B (which amount may be increased or decreased by an amount of up to ten percent (10%)).

The Series 2009B Bonds are being issued for the purpose of (i) funding unfunded liabilities to the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government's Policemen's and Firefighter's Pension Fund and (ii) paying the costs of issuance of the Series 2009B Bonds

SECTION 2. The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government shall comply with the requirements of KRS Chapter 66 and Chapter 424 by advertising for bids for the purchase of the Series 2009B Bonds. The Mayor, the Clerk of the Urban County Council and the Commissioner of Finance are hereby authorized to prepare such instruments and to distribute such information as shall be necessary to accomplish the foregoing, including preparation of a Preliminary Official Statement (the "Preliminary Official Statement") which Preliminary Official Statement is to be deemed final in accordance with Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule"). In order to enable prospective purchasers to submit bids for the purchase of the Series 2009B Bonds, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government hereby covenants and agrees that it will execute, comply with and carry out all of the provisions of a continuing disclosure certificate (the "Continuing Disclosure Certificate") in connection with the issuance of the Series 2009B Bonds. Failure to comply with any such provisions of the Continuing Disclosure Certificate shall not constitute a default on the Series 2009B Bonds; however, any holder of the Series 2009B Bonds, including the beneficial owners of the Series 2009B Bonds, may take such action as may be necessary and appropriate, including seeking specific performance, to cause the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to comply with its obligations under the Continuing Disclosure Certificate. Further the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed on behalf of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to execute all such instruments as shall be necessary to accomplish all of the foregoing.

SECTION 3. Such proposals shall be opened and reviewed by the Commissioner of Finance and/or the Mayor, and shall be acted upon by the Mayor on that same day, without the need for further action by this Urban County Council. The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government hereby approves the "Notice of Bond Sale," substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, to be published as required by law.

SECTION 4. The Mayor of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government shall, in a Certificate of Award accepting the successful bid for the Bonds, determine the exact rate or rates of interest which said Series 2009B Bonds shall bear, and the interest rate or rates on said Series 2009B Bonds shall be automatically fixed at the rate or rates set out in the successful bid accepted by said Certificate of Award. The proceeds of the sale of said Series 2009B Bonds shall be applied to the funding of a portion of the unfunded liabilities in the Pension Fund and expended as provided in the Ordinance authorizing the Series 2009B Bonds.

SECTION 5. In the event that no bid shall be accepted for the purchase of the Series 2009B Bonds, bids may again be solicited for the purchase of the Series 2009B Bonds at a future date and hour at the discretion of the Mayor and/or the Commissioner of Finance, without the necessity of further authorization by the Urban County Council.

SECTION 6. All resolutions or orders or parts thereof, if any, in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution, are to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

SECTION 7. This Resolution shall become effective upon the date of its passage.

Ordinance Authorizing Issuance of Bonds

Authorization is requested to issue \$70 million in taxable general obligation bonds to begin addressing the unfunded liability in the Policemen's and Firefighters' Retirement Fund. The bonds were authorized in the 2008-2009 Budget. Annual debt service of approximately \$5.9 million will be budgeted in the 2009-2010 Budget and for the subsequent nineteen years. A companion resolution is also requested to authorize advertising for bid. Both the ordinance and the resolution are required documents for this bond sale.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE LEXINGTON-FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF TAXABLE GENERAL OBLIGATION PENSION FUNDING BONDS, SERIES 2009B IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$70,000,000 (WHICH AMOUNT MAY BE INCREASED OR DECREASED BY AN AMOUNT OF UP TO TEN PERCENT (10%)) FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING THE COSTS OF FUNDING UNFUNDED LIABILITIES OF THE LEXINGTON-FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY **GOVERNMENT:** THE FORM APPROVING OF THE SERIES 2009B BONDS: **AUTHORIZING** DESIGNATED **OFFICERS** TO EXECUTE DELIVER THE SERIES 2009B BONDS; AUTHORIZING DIRECTING THE FILING OF NOTICE WITH THE STATE LOCAL DEBT OFFICER; PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT AND SECURITY OF THE SERIES 2009B BONDS; CREATING BOND PAYMENT FUNDS: MAINTAINING THE HERETOFORE ESTABLISHED SINKING FUND: AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF THE BID OF THE BOND PURCHASER FOR THE PURCHASE OF THE SERIES 2009B BONDS: AND REPEALING INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES.

WHEREAS, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government (the "Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government"), pursuant to actuarial reports prepared for the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, has previously determined that there exist unfunded liabilities to the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government's Policemen's and Firefighter's Pension Fund (the "Pension Fund") and that there is a need to fund such unfunded liabilities (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government has determined that it is in the best interests of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government that the Project be financed through the issuance by the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government of its Taxable General Obligation Pension Funding Bonds, Series 2009B in the principal amount of \$70,000,000 (which amount may be increased or decreased by an amount of up to ten percent (10%)) (the "Series 2009B Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Constitution and Laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and particularly KRS 66.011 et. seq. (the "Act"), an urban county government may issue bonds, subject to the requirements of the Act, to fund unfunded liabilities; and

WHEREAS, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government desires to finance the Project through the issuance of the Series 2009B Bonds, to be sold and awarded to the successful bidder (the "Purchaser") at public, competitive sale in accordance with the provisions of Section 66.141 et seq. and Chapter 424 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE URBAN COUNTY COUNCIL OF THE LEXINGTON-FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Necessity, Authorization and Purpose. The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government hereby declares that it is necessary to issue and authorizes the issuance of its Taxable General Obligation Pension Funding Bonds, Series 2009B, in an aggregate principal amount of \$70,000,000 (which amount may be increased or decreased by an amount of up to ten percent (10%)) (the "Permitted Adjustment") for the purpose of (i) funding unfunded liabilities to the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government's Policemen's and Firefighter's Pension Fund and (ii) paying the costs of issuance of the Series 2009B Bonds.

The Series 2009B Bonds shall be offered for sale in accordance with the provisions hereof, and the determination of the best bids for the Series 2009B Bonds shall be made on the basis of all bids submitted for \$70,000,000 principal amount of Series 2009B Bonds; provided however, the Permitted Adjustments are reserved by the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government hereunder, with such increases or decreases to be made in any principal maturity so that the total principal amount of Series 2009B Bonds awarded to the best bidder may be a maximum of \$77,000,000 or a minimum of \$63,000,000. In the event of any such Permitted

Adjustment, no rebidding or recalculation of a submitted bid will be required or permitted; the price at which such adjusted principal amount of Series 2009B Bonds will be sold shall be at the same price per \$1,000 of Series 2009B Bonds as the price per \$1,000 of the \$70,000,000 of Series 2009B Bonds bid.

SECTION 2. Form. The Series 2009B Bonds shall be issued as fully registered bonds, shall be designated "Taxable General Obligation Pension Funding Bonds, Series 2009B", shall express upon their faces the purpose for which they are issued, that they are issued under the Act and shall be substantially in the form set forth in *Annex A*.

The Series 2009B Bonds shall be in denominations as requested by the Purchaser, which shall be in integral multiples of five thousand dollars (\$5,000). The Series 2009B Bonds shall each be dated their date of initial issuance and delivery, or such other date as is determined in a certificate of award accepting the bids of the Purchaser (the "Certificate of Award") to be executed by the Mayor following the sale of the Series 2009B Bonds.

Interest on the Series 2009B Bonds shall be payable each [February 1 and August 1 (an "Interest Payment Date"), commencing August 1, 2009], at the stated interest rate or rates on the principal amounts thereof.

The Series 2009B Bonds shall be serial or term bonds maturing, on the basis of substantially level debt service, on [February 1, 2010 and each February 1] thereafter in the years and in the amounts to be established in the Certificate of Award after advertised competitive sale of the Series 2009B Bonds based on the interest rates set forth in the successful bid (the "Series 2009B Bid") and the provisions of this Section 2, provided that the final maturity date of the Series 2009B Bonds shall be as set forth in the Certificate of Award but shall be no later than [February 1, 2034.] The interest rate or rates on the Series 2009B Bonds shall be

determined in the Certificate of Award based on the Series 2009B Bid; provided that the aggregate true interest cost of the Series 2009B Bonds shall not exceed ten percent (10.0%).

The Series 2009B Bonds maturing on and after [February 1, 2019] shall be subject to optional redemption prior to their maturity on any date on or after [February 1, 2018], in whole or in part, in such order of maturities as shall be designated in writing by the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, and by lot within a maturity, at the election of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government upon 45 days' written notice to the Paying Agent and Registrar (hereinafter defined) at a redemption price equal to the par amount thereof, plus accrued interest to such date of redemption or such other redemption date as determined in the Certificate of Award establishing the redemption provisions for the Series 2009B Bonds.

At least thirty (30) days before the optional or mandatory sinking fund redemption date of any Series 2009B Bonds, the Paying Agent and Registrar (as hereinafter defined) shall cause a notice of such redemption either in whole or in part, signed by the Paying Agent and Registrar, to be mailed, first class, postage prepaid, to all registered owners of the Series 2009B Bonds to be redeemed at their addresses as they appear on the registration books kept by the Paying Agent and Registrar, but failure to mail any such notice shall not affect the validity of the proceedings for such redemption of Series 2009B Bonds for which such notice has been sent. Each such notice shall set forth the date fixed for redemption, the redemption price to be paid and, if less than all of the Series 2009B Bonds being payable by their terms on a single date then outstanding shall be called for redemption, the distinctive series, number or letters, if any, of such Series 2009B Bonds to be redeemed.

On the date so designated for redemption, notice having been mailed in the manner under the conditions hereinabove provided and moneys for payment of the redemption price being held in the Series 2009B Bond Payment Fund by the Paying Agent and Registrar for the registered owners of the Series 2009B Bonds to be redeemed, the Series 2009B Bonds so called for redemption shall become and be due and payable at the redemption price provided for redemption of such Series 2009B Bonds on such date, interest on the Series 2009B Bonds so called for redemption shall cease to accrue, and the registered owners of such Series 2009B Bonds shall have no right in respect thereof except to receive payment of the redemption price thereof.

The Series 2009B Bonds may be issued in book-entry-only form through the services of the Depository Trust Company ("DTC"). If the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government determines to issue the Series 2009B Bonds in book-entry-only form the Designated Officers (hereinafter defined) are authorized to execute all documents necessary to accomplish such form of issuance.

SECTION 3. Execution and Delivery. The Series 2009B Bonds shall be executed by the manual or facsimile signature of the Mayor and duly attested by the manual or facsimile signature of the Urban County Council Clerk (which, together with any other person as may be authorized by resolution are referred to as "Designated Officers"), shall have the seal of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government or a facsimile thereof affixed thereto, and shall bear the manual authenticating signature of an authorized representative of the bank designated in the Certificate of Award as the Paying Agent and Registrar for the Series 2009B Bonds (the "Paying Agent and Registrar"). The Designated Officers are further authorized and directed to deliver the Series 2009B Bonds to the Purchaser, upon the terms and conditions provided herein, in the Certificate of Award and in the Bid, receive the proceeds therefor, execute and deliver such certificates and other closing documents and take such other action as may be necessary or

appropriate in order to effectuate the proper issuance, sale and delivery of the Series 2009B Bonds.

The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government hereby authorizes and directs the Paying Agent and Registrar to authenticate the Series 2009B Bonds and to deliver the Series 2009B Bonds to the Purchaser upon payment of the purchase price thereof.

SECTION 4. Filing. The Designated Officers are hereby authorized to undertake and cause all filings of notices or information which may be required by law to be filed by the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, including, but not limited to, the filing with the State Local Debt Officer required by law.

SECTION 5. Series 2009B Bond Payment Fund; Payment of Series 2009B Bonds. There is hereby established with the Paying Agent and Registrar a bond payment fund in the name of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to be known as Taxable General Obligation Pension Funding Bonds, Series 2009B Bond Payment Fund (the "Series 2009B Bond Payment Fund"), into which the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government covenants to deposit, and into which the Designated Officers are hereby authorized and directed to deposit from the Sinking Fund (heretofore established or created), on or before the twenty-fifth day of each month which precedes an Interest Payment Date, the amounts required to pay principal of and interest due on the Series 2009B Bonds on such Interest Payment Date. The Paying Agent and Registrar shall, without further authorization from the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government withdraw from the Series 2009B Bond Payment Fund, on such Interest Payment Date, the amounts necessary to pay principal of, and interest on, the Series 2009B Bonds to the registered owner of the same.

Payment of or on account of the interest on and principal of the Series 2009B Bonds shall be made directly to the Paying Agent and Registrar for the account of the registered owner. Interest on the Series 2009B Bonds shall be payable by check, mailed to the person whose name appears on the fifteenth day preceding an Interest Payment Date on the bond registration records as the registered owner, on each Interest Payment Date or by other transfer of funds acceptable to such registered owner and the Paying Agent and Registrar. Principal shall be payable in such coin or currency of the United States of America as shall be legal tender for the payment of public and private debts at the time and place of payment upon delivery of the Series 2009B Bonds to the Paying Agent and Registrar or by other transfer of funds acceptable to the Paying Agent and Registrar and such registered owner. All such payments shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge the liability upon such Series 2009B Bonds to the extent of the sum or sums so paid.

The Paying Agent and Registrar is hereby appointed depository of the Series 2009B Bond Payment Fund with respect to the Series 2009B Bonds.

If the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government shall fail or refuse to make any required deposit in the Series 2009B Bond Payment Fund from the Sinking Fund, the Paying Agent and Registrar shall (i) notify any agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky or any political subdivision thereof which may collect and distribute taxes or revenues for the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government to seek any available necessary or proper remedial action; and (ii) upon being indemnified against cost and expense, exercise any remedy provided in the Act or at law or in equity for the benefit of the owner of the Series 2009B Bonds or its assignee, and shall disburse all funds so collected to the owners of the Series 2009B Bonds as payment of the Series 2009B Bonds.

SECTION 6. General Obligation. The Bonds shall be full general obligations of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government and, for the payment of said Bonds and the interest thereon, the full faith, credit and revenue of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government are hereby pledged for the prompt payment thereof. During the period the Series 2009B Bonds are outstanding, there shall be and there hereby is levied on all the taxable property in the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, in addition to all other taxes, without limitation as to rate, a direct tax annually in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the Series 2009B Bonds when and as due, it being hereby found and determined that current tax rates are within all applicable limitations. Said tax shall be and is hereby ordered computed, certified, levied and extended upon the tax duplicate and collected by the same officers in the same manner and at the same time that taxes for general purposes for each of said years are certified, extended and collected. Said tax shall be placed before and in preference to all other items and for the full amount thereof provided, however, that in each year to the extent that the other lawfully available funds of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government are available for the payment of the Series 2009B Bonds and are appropriated for such purpose, including the proceeds of the Series 2009B Bonds, the amount of such direct tax upon all of the taxable property in the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government shall be reduced by the amount of such other funds so available and appropriated.

SECTION 7. Maintenance of Sinking Fund. There has heretofore been established with the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government a sinking fund (the "Sinking Fund"), which is hereby ordered maintained so long as any of the Series 2009B Bonds shall remain outstanding. The funds derived from the tax levy required by Section 7 hereof or other lawfully available funds shall be placed in the Sinking Fund and, together with interest collected on the

same, are irrevocably pledged for the payment of the interest on and principal of all bonds issued under the Act and Tax-Supported Leases, as defined in the Act, when and as the same fall due.

Amounts shall be transferred from the Sinking Fund to the Series 2009B Bond Payment Fund at the times and in the amounts required by Section 6 hereof.

SECTION 8. Sale of Bonds; Certificate of Award. The Designated Officers are hereby directed to sell the Series 2009B Bonds to the Purchaser at advertised competitive sale, the final principal amount of, the principal amortization of and the interest rate or rates on the Series 2009B Bonds to be established in accordance with the requirements of Sections 1 and 2 hereof by adoption of the Certificate of Award. The Mayor of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government is hereby authorized to execute the Certificate of Award establishing the terms of the Series 2009B Bonds described herein and any other provisions required by and not inconsistent with this Bond Ordinance without any further action by the Urban County Council.

SECTION 9. Registered Owner; Transfer; Exchange. As long as the Series 2009B Bonds executed and delivered hereunder shall remain outstanding, the Paying Agent and Registrar shall maintain an office for the registration of such Series 2009B Bonds and shall also keep at such office books for such registration and transfers. The registered owners of the Series 2009B Bonds, as set forth in the registration books maintained by the Paying Agent and Registrar on the fifteenth day preceding the Interest Payment Date, or its assignees, for purposes of this Bond Ordinance, to the extent of its interest, shall be treated as the owner of the applicable Series 2009B Bonds and shall be entitled to all rights and security of the owner of the applicable Series 2009B Bonds hereunder.

Upon surrender for registration of transfer of Series 2009B Bonds at the office of the Paying Agent and Registrar with a written instrument of transfer satisfactory to the Paying Agent

and Registrar, duly executed by the registered owner or the registered owner's duly authorized attorney, the Paying Agent and Registrar shall execute and deliver, in the name of the designated transferee or transferees, one or more Series 2009B Bonds of any authorized denomination and of a like tenor and effect.

All Series 2009B Bonds, upon surrender thereof at the office of the Paying Agent and Registrar, may, at the option of the registered owner thereof be exchanged for an equal aggregate principal amount of Series 2009B Bonds of the same series of any authorized denomination.

In all cases in which the privilege of exchanging or transferring Series 2009B Bonds is exercised, the Paying Agent and Registrar shall execute and deliver Series 2009B Bonds in accordance with the provisions of this Section. Every such exchange or transfer of Series 2009B Bonds, whether temporary or definitive, shall be without charge; provided that the Paying Agent and Registrar may impose a charge sufficient to reimburse it or the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government for any tax, fee or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to such exchange or transfer, which sum or sums shall be paid by the person requesting such exchange or transfer as a condition precedent to the exercise of the privilege of making such exchange or transfer.

SECTION 10. Book-entry System. For purposes of this Bond Ordinance, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

"Book entry form" or "book entry system" means a form or system under which (i) the beneficial right to payment of principal of and interest on the Series 2009B Bonds may be transferred only through a book entry, and (ii) physical Series 2009B Bond certificates in fully registered form are issued only to the Depository or its nominee as registered owner, with the Series 2009B Bonds "immobilized" to the custody of the Depository, and the book entry

maintained by others than the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government or the Paying Agent and Registrar is the record that identifies the owners of beneficial interests in those Series 2009B Bonds and that principal and interest.

"Depository" means any securities depository that is a clearing agency under federal law operating and maintaining, together with its Participants or otherwise, a book entry system to record ownership of beneficial interests in Series 2009B Bonds or principal and interest, and to effect transfers of Series 2009B Bonds, in book entry form, and includes and means initially The Depository Trust Company (a limited purpose trust company), New York, New York.

"Participant" means any participant contracting with a Depository under a book entry system and includes security brokers and dealers, banks and trust companies, and clearing corporations.

All or any portion of the Series 2009B Bonds may be initially issued to a Depository for use in a book entry system, and the provisions of this Section 9 shall apply to such Series 2009B Bonds, notwithstanding any other provision of this Bond Ordinance. If and as long as a book entry system is utilized with respect to any such Series 2009B Bonds: (i) there shall be such number of Series 2009B Bonds of each maturity as the Depository shall specify; (ii) those Series 2009B Bonds shall be registered in the name of the Depository or its nominee, as registered owner, and immobilized in the custody of the Depository; (iii) the beneficial owners of Series 2009B Bonds in book entry form shall have no right to receive Series 2009B Bonds in the form of physical securities or certificates; (iv) ownership of beneficial interests in any Series 2009B Bonds in book entry form shall be shown by book entry on the system maintained and operated by the Depository and its Participants, and transfers of the ownership of beneficial interests shall be made only by book entry by the Depository and its Participants; and (v) the Series 2009B

Bonds as such shall not be transferable or exchangeable, except for transfer to another Depository or to another nominee of a Depository, without further action by the Urban County Council. Debt service charges on Series 2009B Bonds in book entry form registered in the name of a Depository or its nominee shall be payable in the manner provided in the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government's agreement with the Depository to the Depository or its authorized representative (i) in the case of interest, on each Interest Payment Date, and (ii) in all other cases, upon presentation and surrender of Series 2009B Bonds as provided in this Bond Ordinance.

The Paying Agent and Registrar may, with the approval of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, enter into an agreement with the beneficial owner or registered owner of any Series 2009B Bond in the custody of a Depository providing for making all payments to that owner of principal and interest on that Series 2009B Bond or any portion thereof (other than any payment of the entire unpaid principal amount thereof) at a place and in a manner (including wire transfer of federal funds) other than as provided in this Bond Ordinance, without prior presentation or surrender of the Series 2009B Bond, upon any conditions which shall be satisfactory to the Paying Agent and Registrar and to the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government. That payment in any event shall be made to the person who is the registered owner of that Series 2009B Bond on the date that principal is due, or, with respect to the payment of interest, as of the applicable date agreed upon as the case may be. The Paying Agent and Registrar shall furnish a copy of each of those agreements, certified to be correct by the Paying Agent and Registrar, to any other paying agents for Series 2009B Bonds and to the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government. Any payment of principal or interest pursuant to such an agreement shall constitute payment thereof pursuant to, and for all purposes of, this Bond Ordinance.

The Mayor of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government is authorized and directed to execute, acknowledge and deliver, in the name of and on behalf of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government a letter agreement among the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, the Paying Agent and Registrar and The Depository Trust Company, as Depository, to be delivered in connection with the issuance of the Series 2009B Bonds to the Depository for use in a book entry system.

If any Depository determines not to continue to act as depository for the Series 2009B Bonds for use in a book entry system, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government and the Paying Agent and Registrar may attempt to establish a securities depository/book entry relationship with another qualified Depository under this Bond Ordinance. If the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government and the Paying Agent and Registrar do not or are unable to do so, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government and the Paying Agent and Registrar, after the Paying Agent and Registrar has made provision for notification of the beneficial owners by the then Depository, shall permit withdrawal of the Series 2009B Bonds from the Depository and authenticate and deliver Series 2009B Bond certificates in fully registered form to the assigns of the Depository or its nominee, all at the cost and expense (including costs of printing definitive Series 2009B Bonds), if the event is not the result of action or inaction by the Urban County Council or the Paying Agent and Registrar, of those persons requesting such issuance.

SECTION 11. Disposition of Proceeds. The proceeds of the sale of the Series 2009B Bonds shall be deposited, together with other available funds of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, as follows: (a) accrued interest, if any, shall be deposited to the Series 2009B Bond Payment Fund created in Section 5 hereof, (b) an amount to fund a portion of the unfunded liabilities in the Pension Fund shall be deposited therein; and (c) the remainder of

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Statutes, and pursuant to an ordinance duly adopted by the Urban County Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government on the _____ day of February, 2009 (the "Bond Ordinance") upon the affirmative vote of at least a majority of the members of its Urban County Council at a public meeting duly and regularly held and after filing proper notice with the State Local Debt Officer of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

This Series 2009B Bond and the issue of which it forms a part is a general obligation of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government and the full faith, credit and revenue of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government are pledged to the payments due hereunder. THIS SERIES 2009B BOND IS CONTINUALLY SECURED BY THE FAITH, CREDIT AND REVENUE OF THE LEXINGTON-FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT.

The Series 2009B Bonds mature on the first day of February of the following years, in the respective principal amounts and bear interest at the following rates of interest:

The Series 2009B Bonds maturing on and after [February 1, 2019 shall be subject to optional redemption prior to their maturity on any date on or after February 1, 2018], in whole or in part, in such order of maturity as shall be designated in writing by the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, and by lot within a maturity, at the election of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government upon 45 days' written notice to the Paying Agent and Registrar (hereinafter defined) at a redemption price equal to the par amount thereof, plus accrued interest to the date of redemption.

At least thirty (30) days before the redemption date of any Series 2009B Bonds the Paying Agent and Registrar shall cause a notice of such redemption signed by the Paying Agent and Registrar, to be mailed, first class, postage prepaid, to all registered owners of the Series 2009B Bonds to be redeemed at their addresses as they appear on the registration books kept by the Paying Agent and Registrar, but failure to mail any such notice shall not affect the validity of the proceedings for such redemption of Series 2009B Bonds for which such notice has been sent. Each such notice shall set forth the date fixed for redemption, the redemption price to be paid and, if less than all of the Series 2009B Bonds being payable by their terms on a single date then outstanding shall be called for redemption, the distinctive number or letters, if any, of such Bonds to be redeemed.

On the date so designated for redemption, notice having been published in the manner under the conditions hereinabove provided and moneys for payment of the redemption price being held in the Series 2009B Bond Payment Fund by the Paying Agent and Registrar for the registered owners of the Series 2009B Bonds to be redeemed, the Series 2009B Bonds so called for redemption shall become and be due and payable at the redemption price provided for

redemption of such Bonds on such date, interest on the Series 2009B Bonds so called for redemption shall cease to accrue, and the registered owners of such Series 2009B Bonds shall have no right in respect thereof except to receive payment of the redemption price thereof.

No recourse shall be had for the payment of the principal of or the interest on this Series 2009B Bond, or for any claim based hereon, against any officer, agent or employee, past, present or future, of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, as such, either directly or through the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, whether by virtue of any constitutional provision, statute or rule of law, or by the enforcement of any assessment or penalty, or otherwise; all such liability of such officers, agents or employees is hereby renounced, waived and released as a condition of and as consideration for the issuance, execution and acceptance of this Series 2009B Bond.

It is hereby certified that all acts, conditions and things required to be done, to occur or be performed precedent to and in the issuance of this Series 2009B Bond, or in the creation of the obligations of which this Series 2009B Bond is evidence, have been done, have occurred and have been performed in regular and due form and manner as required by law; that the faith, credit and revenue of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government are hereby irrevocably pledged for the prompt payment of the principal hereof and interest hereon; that the repayment obligation represented by this Series 2009B Bond is not in excess of any constitutional or statutory limitation; and that due provision has been made for the levy and collection of a tax sufficient in amount to pay the interest on this Series 2009B Bond as it falls due and to provide for the redemption of this Series 2009B Bond at maturity or upon earlier redemption.

The purpose of this reimbursement resolution is to allow spending on the Lyric Theatre project, approved in the amount of \$6 million in the 2008-2009 Budget. This resolution provides a mechanism for the project to move forward prior to the sale of the bonds. Expenditures for the project will be from the General Fund and reimbursed upon the sale of the bonds later this fiscal year. Most of the other 2009 projects were approved in a prior resolution. However, the Lyric project was not, awaiting a business plan from AMS Planning and Research which is now complete. The practice of approval of a reimbursement resolution is consistent with prior practice and is a generally accepted mechanism in the accounting community.

Inter-Governmental Committee

February 10, 2009

CM James chaired the meeting, calling it to order at 1:05 pm. All members were present except Gray, Henson and Myers. CM James told the committee; CM Feigel has agreed to serve as Vice Chair of the Intergovernmental Committee.

I. Grievance Procedures

CM James who referred this item to committee asked Leslie Jarvis, HR Department to provide an update. Mr. Jarvis said her staff was asked to review the grievance procedure outlined in the ordinance for obstacles or issues that might need improvement in order to make the process more effective. She asked 10 business and local governments about their grievance process and with that a survey is in draft form, however, has not yet been finalized. They have consulted PIO about providing employees an electronic version of the survey when it becomes available.

CM Blues asked about a timeline for completion of the survey. Ms. Jarvis responded that in order to maintain the current work load, and work on People soft Project Synergy, it was not possible to give the survey full attention at this time. Blues told HR he thought review of the grievance process and a survey were important and he would like to see it given priority.

CM James asked Comm. Koch about completion. Koch told the committee due to staff shortages and People soft implementation she would take responsibility for why the survey was not done. She explained there were many HR processes that needed to be reviewed in order to take advantage of the People soft software, installation and many HR staff have been directed towards that effort. CM James asked how the Intergovernmental Committee or council could assist in completion of these types of legislative requests. She expressed concern that the survey was not completed and grievances still coming in from employees, Koch assured her this was a high priority of the administration as well.

II. Citizens Advocate Policy & Procedures

Joan Beck gave the update telling the committee the SOP information was passed along to the Law Department and a review is currently on-going. She is working with the IT Department to identify software to track and record cases,

issues, etc. Glenda George, Law Department commented telling the committee she hopes to have a draft of the changes available in approx. one week.

CM Blues asked if the draft would go back to the sub-committee which was chaired by CM Myers or directly to Intergovernmental Committee. CM James and Blues agreed the draft of the review should come before Intergovernmental Committee when it was ready.

III. Update on Committee Items

Paul Schoninger, Council Staff advised the committee there were three items on the list he was waiting for advice from CM Myers to delete or not. CM James mentioned the list now contained a "status column" to assist with tracking purposes.

No motions came from any issues on today's agenda.

A motion by CM James to adjourn seconded by CM Beard, passed without dissent.

The meeting adjourned at 1:23 p.m.
