Fellows are expected to properly manage their schedule in order to complete, often time sensitive, projects in an efficient manner, while providing a high-quality product.

Junior and senior undergraduates, as well as graduate students are encouraged to apply for the Fellowship. Summer Fellows are expected to work approximately forty hours a week for ten weeks from May to August, and will be compensated \$10 per hour.
