Class B (Education) Grants

1. Bryan Station High School (Fayette County Public Schools)

Target Watershed: North Elkhorn

The project involves the design and installation of a rain garden expansion on the Bryan Station Middle School campus. The project also incorporates the rain garden into the environmental education curriculum and provides community outreach. Bryan Station High School AP Science students will host an evening workshop for students and their families to visit the rain garden and hear from local experts on the importance of stormwater quality.

2. Growing Together Preschool, Inc.

Target Watershed: Town Branch

The purpose of the project is to provide stormwater education to students and neighbors of Growing Together Preschool. The school will work in conjunction with the Klausing Group to design and construct two rain gardens at the school to be utilized by students, staff, parents, family members, and the community members to demonstrate the positive effects rain gardens have on the community.

3. Living Arts and Science Center, Inc.
