Stormwater Quality Projects Incentive Grant  
Program Summary of Grant Projects – FY2016*

**Class A (Neighborhood) Grants**

- 1. Residents Inc. DBA The Colony Neighborhood Association** **Grant Amount: \$6,507.50**  
Target Watershed: Wolf Run

The objective for this project is to improve water quality by the creation of a stream buffer for Wildcat Chase Stream, a tributary to Cardinal Run and Wolf Run. Elements of the project include eradication of invasive plants and replacement of native plants in the area, as well as water quality sampling.
- 2. Friends of Wolf Run, Inc.** **Grant Amount: \$32,820.00**  
Target Watershed: Wolf Run

Grant provides for funds to support the stream buffer stewardship program for Wolf Run. Activities include performing stream clean-ups, removal of invasive plant species, and planting of native vegetation along Wolf Run and its tributaries at various volunteer-selected stewardship sites. Furthermore, the project will provide educational outreach by communication with streamside property owners and installation of educational signage at stewardship sites.
- 3. Gardenside Neighborhood Association** **Grant Amount: \$6,000.00**  
Target Watershed: Wolf Run

The objective of this project is to improve water quality at 1835 Yorktown Road also known as Gardenside Park. Elements of this project include bank stabilization along Wolf Run, an education marker, dye tracing, and a stream buffer restoration, which is in relation to the Friends of Wolf Run Grant.
- 4. Hamburg Homeowners Association** **Grant Amount: \$11,500.00**  
Target Watershed: North Elkhorn

The goal of this project is to improve water quality through the design and installation of a new rain garden at the 2364 Rockminster Road property and the addition of plantings at the existing rain garden at 889 Star Shoot Parkway.
- 5. Idle Hour Neighbors Alliance, Inc.** **Grant Amount: \$6,910.00**  
Target Watershed: West Hickman

This grant will provide funding for a stream buffer installed along the unnamed creek that borders the Idle Hour Greenspace at 209 St. Ann Drive. All plant species will be native to Kentucky. The project's goal is to improve water quality and reduce water quantity in the area.
- 6. North Limestone Community Development Corporation (NoLi CDC)** **Grant Amount: \$91,393.30**  
Target Watershed: Cane Run

This grant will provide funds for the NoLi CDC, in partnership with the North Limestone, Castlewood, and Martin Luther King Neighborhood Associations, to administer the "2016 North Limestone Sustainability Initiative (NLSI)." The NLSI is a plan to resolve stormwater issues in the Northside Neighborhoods by implementing 4 project sub-plans and improving the water quality in the area.
- 7. Prestwick Condominiums Association, Inc.** **Grant Amount: \$53,940.00**  
Target Watershed: North Elkhorn

The goal of this project is to provide water quality and quantity control by the design and installation of rain gardens, rock-lined swales, and a bioswale at the Prestwick Condominium Association property. The project plans to address drainage from the property along with water coming from offsite.
