

This memorandum will provide a synopsis of the investigation; however, other supporting documents may be viewed in conjunction with this memorandum.

On February 23, 2021 Lieutenant Paul Boyles filed a formal complaint against Officer Andrew Strong 52638 for violation of General Order 1973-02K, Disciplinary Procedures of Sworn Officers Appendix B, Operational Rule 1.35 – Violating Any Rules of the Department, G.O. 2011-08F Emergency and Pursuit Driving.

# **Allegations:**



# **Investigation**

On Wednesday February 17, 2021 Detective Strong was heading home when he heard a dispatched call for a vehicle heading the wrong direction on the outer loop of New Circle Road near Tates Creek Road. Instead of heading home he continued out Harrodsburg Road and entered onto the outer loop of New Circle Road.

Immediately after he exited the entrance ramp he observed the suspect vehicle in his lane of traffic, causing him to swerve to avoid collision. When the vehicle had passed him he completed a U-turn with his emergency lights activated, his intention was to pull them over before they collided with any approaching vehicles. The speed of the vehicle when he turned around was between 40-45 mph.

Upon first contact with the vehicle Detective Strong announced through his P.A. System for the suspect to pull over, the vehicle did not pull over, but the suspect did turn his turn signal on as if he were getting ready to. Detective Strong once again made a command through the P.A. System for the suspect to pull over, which again the suspect ignored. Throughout the exchange the speed of the suspect never varied, he continued between 40-45 mph.

It was at this time Detective Strong observed the headlights of approaching vehicles coming towards them, so he immediately pulled off to the side of the road with the intentions of turning around after they had passed. At the same time he pulled to the side of the road the suspect did also. Once the vehicles passed Detective Strong approached and made contact with the suspect of the vehicle. The suspect appeared to be intoxicated and was later arrested for Driving under the Influence by Patrol Units. The entire length of the incident was less than 1 mile.

During this incident Sergeant Boyd heard Detective Strong on the radio stating the vehicle was not stopping, he advised the dispatcher that if anyone were following the suspect they were to terminate. This directive was given as Detective Strong was pulling to the side of the roadway to allow the passing traffic to pass.

### **Detective Strong's Interview**

Detective Strong was interviewed in the Public Integrity Office by myself and Lieutenant Matt Brotherton on March 3, 2021. He was very forthcoming and detailed about the event. He stated at first he headed towards New Circle Road because he was close and he believed he would located the suspect somewhere wrecked out or on the side of the roadway, due to the lack of updates from the dispatcher. When he entered onto New Circle Road and immediately had to maneuver out of the way to avoid a collision with the suspect his first thoughts were he needed to stop him so he didn't collide with any innocent victims heading their way.

He did realize at the time that pursuing a vehicle on the wrong side of the roadway was a violation of our policy, but he stated he never felt it was a pursuit, more just that the suspect didn't realize he was behind him. The speeds of the vehicle and the suspect turning the Turn Signal on made him believe he was going to pull over at any moment. He also advised that if the suspect had ever sped up, or became reckless he would have ended his involvement immediately.

### Conclusion

After investigating this incident it is obvious that Detective Strong did in fact violate G.O. 2011-08F Emergency and Pursuit Driving policy. He operated his cruiser in a manner that violated policy. He appears to be regretful in his decisions during this incident and understands the policies that he violated.

**ALLEGATION**: Violating General Order 1973-02K Disciplinary Procedures, Appendix B, Operational Rule 1.35 Violating Any Rules of the Department, specifically: General Order 2011-08F Emergency and Pursuit Driving, Section V, Paragraph H(6) which states:

"Officers shall not immediately follow a pursued vehicle traveling in the wrong direction on a limited access highway. If officers decide to continue the pursuit they shall follow the pursued vehicle while traveling on the correct side of the limited access highway."

**ALLEGED CIRCUMSTANCES:** On Wednesday, February 17th, 2021, at approximately 0213, Detective Andrew Strong attempted to conduct a traffic stop on a vehicle traveling the wrong way on the outer-loop of New Circle Road at Harrodsburg Road. In the course of effecting the traffic stop, Detective Strong engaged in a brief pursuit while traveling the wrong way on a limited access highway.

#### **ACTION REQUESTED:**

- The Bureau Commander and Detective Strong should sign the Acknowledgment Sheet and process this complaint.
- The Commanding Officer should provide the attached copy of the Form 111 and the Officer's Rights Packet to Detective Strong.
- Detective Strong should contact the Public Integrity Unit to arrange for a time to provide a formal statement.
