Effective, Monday, August 16, 2021, Detective Robert Terry will be suspended without pay for one (1) day, for violation of General Order 1973-02K, Disciplinary Procedures of Sworn Officers, Appendix B, Operational Rule 1.35 – Violating Any Rules of the Department, (GO 2011-08F – Emergency and Pursuit Driving).

Detective Terry is to surrender <u>all</u> police credentials and division-owned equipment. Detective Terry's suspension from duty eliminates his right to carry concealed deadly weapons, make arrests, and any other law enforcement duties.

Upon return to duty, Detective Terry will be scheduled for one (1) week Home Fleet suspension, beginning August $16^{th} - 22^{nd}$, 2021.

The Urban County Council approved this suspension on August 12, 2021.

AGREEMENT OF CONFORMITY WITH KRS 95.450 / 15.520 AND RELEASE

FORM 113 (8/20) An allegation has been made that: Officer Robert Terry #38279 has committed the offense of: Violating Any Rules of the Department - Emergency and Pursuit Driving which constitutes misconduct under the provisions of KRS 95.450 and/or KRS 15.520 (list other applicable law or rule) General Order 1973-02K Disciplinary Procedures of Sworn Officers, Appendix B, Operational Rule 1.35 Violating Any Rules of the Department (GO 2011-08F Emergency and Pursuit Driving) day(s) of <u>April</u>, 20 <u>21</u> he/she allegedly: 26th in that on the On Monday, April 26, 2021 Detective Robert Terry engaged in a vehicle pursuit of a known suspect with felony warrants for his arrest. The suspect's reckless vehicle operation created substantial risk to the public during the pursuit and posed no immediate danger just prior to the pursuit. Once it was apparent the suspect was fleeing from his attempt to stop the vehicle combined with the suspect's reckless operation of his vehicle, Detective Terry should have disengaged any attempt to stop the vehicle. Detective Terry violated the above listed policy which states "Unless a greater hazard would result, a pursuit should not be initiated if the subject(s) can be identified with enough certainty that they can be apprehended at a later time." This is Detective Terry's first sustained formal complaint since being employed on February 21, 2000. He understands his actions were against policy and has accepted full responsibility. I have read KRS 95.450, 95.460 and 15.520, and attest that I fully understand all rights guaranteed by these statutes, including the rights to have formal charges preferred and a hearing conducted on those charges. Further, I, with knowledge of the provisions and my rights under KRS 95.450, 95.460, and 15.520 and in consideration of the recommendation of the Chief of Police of the Lexington Police Department, acknowledge that the appropriate punishment for this conduct is: One (1) day Suspension without Pay, and one (1) week Suspension of Home Fleet privilege

I do hereby voluntarily accept the above disciplinary action, provided that the punishment awarded by the

Urban County Council will not exceed the above recommendation of the Chief of Police.

If the Urban County Council rejects the above recommendation, I will be so notified, in which case I may withdraw my acceptance, and will be entitled to all rights, as applicable, under KRS 95.450, 95.460 and 15.520, and this agreement will not be used against me or by me in any hearing in determination of my guilt of punishment.

In further consideration of the acceptance of the above recommendation and penalty by the Urban County Council, I do for myself, my heirs, legal representatives, as assigns hereby expressly release and forever discharge the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, its officers, agents, employees, and their successors and assigns from all claims, demands, actions, damages or causes of action and from all liability for damages of whatsoever kind, nature of description that I ever had, now have or may have against the aforementioned entities created by or arising out of the action contained herein.

This memorandum will provide a synopsis of the investigation; however, other supporting documents may be viewed in conjunction with this memorandum.

On May 26, 2021 Lieutenant Matthew Greathouse filed a formal complaint against Officer Robert Terry 38279 for violation of General Order 1973-02K, Disciplinary Procedures of Sworn Officers Appendix B, Operational Rule 1.35 – Violating Any Rules of the Department, G.O. 2011-08F Emergency and Pursuit Driving.

Allegations:

On Monday April 26, 2021, at approximately 14:32 hours, Detective Robert Terry engaged in a vehicle pursuit while assisting the U.S. Marshall's in the apprehension of a wanted suspect with warrants for felony offenses. While monitoring radio traffic he heard the suspect had left his residence in a vehicle and subsequently observed the vehicle on near Officer Terry activated his emergency equipment and attempted to catch up with the suspect. The suspect accelerated to high speeds on a heavily traveled roadway and began driving in a reckless manner.

While observing this behavior, Detective Terry continued with the pursuit as the suspect entered traffic heading the wrong way on towards and through the red light, where he continued inbound. Detective Terry continued to pursue the suspect vehicle and appeared to attempt to transmit radio traffic at this point, however was unable to get through on the radio. It is just prior to the suspect's vehicle crossing into oncoming traffic on near where the suspect was involved in a single vehicle collision, that dispatch is notified of the pursuit. After the collision, the suspect immediately fled on foot and was apprehended by other units on

While the suspect was wanted for felony warrants, police personnel knew the suspect's name and information prior to the pursuit. The suspect's reckless vehicle operation created substantial risk to the public during the pursuit and posed no immediate danger prior. Detective Terry should have terminated the pursuit when he realized the suspect was fleeing in a reckless manner and attempted to pick him up at a later time and location.

Investigation

After receiving the complaint I reviewed the BWC Footage involved in the case. From that footage the following observations can be made.

Officer Terry can be observed pursuing a known suspect on
with moderate to heavy traffic in the vicinity. The suspect is not obeying traffic regulations and is obviously fleeing from him. As both vehicles approach the suspect maneuvers into the opposing lane, to get around vehicles that are stopped at the traffic signal. At this time there is no traffic coming towards the suspect and Officer Terry does stay in the correct lanes, maneuvering through and around the cars.

After getting through the traffic and onto , the suspect vehicle can be seen heading inbound, crossing over Officer Terry continues to pursue and attempts to advise radio of the situation. As he approaches he is able to see the suspect has wrecked his vehicle and is now running on foot through their property. Over the course of a short foot pursuit other units at the scene are able to secure the suspect and take him into custody.

Officer Robert Terry's Interview

I interviewed Officer Terry in the PIU Office on June 1, 2021. During the interview Officer Terry did admit to his temporary lapse in judgement, by pursuing the known suspect. He advised his mindset was of concern in not apprehending him, due to his alleged violent past and the crimes they were attempting to charge him with. He was regretful for his actions and vowed not to violate policy again.

Conclusion

After investigating this incident it is obvious that Officer Terry did in fact violate G.O. 2011-08F Emergency and Pursuit Driving policy. He operated his cruiser in a manner that violated policy.
