Sir,

This memorandum will provide a summary of the investigation into the Formal Complaints filed by Commander Chris Schnelle on Officer Anthony Delimpo.

On November 3rd, 2022, Commander Schnelle signed a formal complaint that alleged the following:

On August 23, 2022 at approximately 1610 hours Officer Anthony Delimpo was arrested for Operating a Motor Vehicle under the influence of Alcohol KRS 189A.010(1A) 1st offense. Officer Delimpo was off-duty and in his personal vehicle at the time of the incident. On September 29, 2022 Officer Delimpo pled guilty to the above charge.

If the above allegation is true, Officer Anthony Delimpo is in violation of General Order 1973-02K Disciplinary Procedures of Sworn Officers, Appendix B, Operational Rule 1.01 Adherence to Laws, Regulations and Orders which states:

"Officers shall abide by all laws, ordinances, and regulations, of the United States, Commonwealth of Kentucky, and Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government."

Investigation

On August 23rd, 2022, Officer Delimpo was located driving on I-64 while intoxicated. Sgt. Tim Graul charged Officer Delimpo with DUI. He was located, stationary on the shoulder of I-64 in Fayette County. Officer Delimpo was not involved in any collisions or traffic infractions during the incident.

On September 29th, 2022, Officer Delimpo pled guilty to one count of Operating a Motor Vehicle under the Influence of Alcohol. His penalty was a 4-6 month license suspension, Alcohol Driver Education classes, no hardship license, and a financial fine.

Interview with Officer Anthony Delimpo

On November 15th, 2022, Lt. Biroshik and I interviewed Officer Anthony Delimpo in the PIU Office. Mr. Scott Crosbie was present as Officer Delimpo's representative.

Officer Delimpo admitted that he was driving while intoxicated and that he has an alcohol abuse problem. He did not deny that he broke the law and violated department policy. Officer Delimpo stated that he began drinking heavily in an attempt to cope with a family member's life threatening illness.

Officer Delimpo also detailed the in-patient counseling he attended after the arrest, and his continuing work to address his addiction.

At no point during the interview did Officer Delimpo attempt to blame anything other than himself for his actions.

Conclusion

Officer Delimpo did not dispute the allegations. He readily stated that he drove while intoxicated, and that he was in violation of the law and Department policy.
