### **About the Program**

Parent and Guardian Empowerment (PAGE) assists young people in reaching their highest potential by offering free positive opportunities and programs. PAGE strives to help parents/guardians gain the support, skills, and confidence they need to guide and motivate their youth while reducing conflict. In turn, the parents/guardians feel empowered.

Experienced social workers work with each family to assess challenges and problems, then develop a service plan with the goal of preventing future behavior issues and reducing the chances of conflict with family, peers and status charges being filed.

### **Our Mission**

To provide youth under the age of 18 who are navigating their adolescent years and their families with specialized case management services.

Youth Advocate Programs Inc (YAP for short) is a national high impact social change non-profit advocating for and delivering evidence-based services in homes and communities as a more effective and racially equitable alternative to youth incarceration, congregate care, child welfare and neighborhood violence.

Neighborhood based advocates are trained to help participants and their parents, guardians and families see their strengths and connect them with tools – even basic needs resources – to achieve positive goals.

86% of participants do not reoffend; 90% still live in their communities – 12 months after completing the YAP program.

### HOW TO COMMUNICATE WITH AND LISTEN TO YOUR TEEN

Many parents have questions that start with, "What do I say when...?" However, parents need to understand that it is "less important what you say, and more important that you listen."

 Turn off the "parent alarm." Listen without judgment and reaction. When your son says, "Mom, I met this girl" and you react by saying, "You're too young to date," that instinctual alarm prevented you from being able to hold a meaningful discussion on healthy sexuality.

 Don't catastrophize. When teens come to their parents with concerns, they need a calming, rational presence that will create a safe space for them to figure things out. When parents make it seem worse than they had imagined, they leave more anxious and won't return.

3. Don't over empathize. Adolescents need a sounding board. Sometimes they exaggerate; sometimes they express fleeting feelings. When you over empathize, it can heighten their emotions and make you look naïve or overly involved. Imagine your empathizing by condemning their friend who your daughter had a fight with. You'll look "wrong" the next day when your daughter is best friends again with the girl she hated yesterday.

Your Values & Opinions Teens are happy to hear their parents' values and opinions, but these opinions should not be shared in a way that feels judgmental or condescending and should try to avoid personal territory that will position a teen to need to become defensive of friends or self.

Avoid "The Lecture" Parents who lecture are not heard. The lecture is often condescending or hostile, and is delivered with an abstract string of possibilities loosely tied together. Young adolescents are still not thinking abstractly, and all teens who are upset or in crisis mode will not absorb lessons delivered abstractly. Parents may increase their yield if they are able to convey their wisdom in a more concrete manner that adolescents can follow.
