Sir.

This memorandum will provide a synopsis of the investigation; however, other supporting documents may be viewed in conjunction with this memorandum.

On February 27th, 2023 Lieutenant Brian Peterson filed a formal complaint against Detective Derrick Walton that alleged the following:

On October 30, 2022 at approximately 1854 hours, Detective Derrick Walton was off-duty driving his personal vehicle when he was involved in motor vehicle collision in Scott County, Kentucky. Detective Walton was deemed at-fault in the collision, which caused injuries to the other motorist. As a result of the collision he was arrested for Operating a Motor Vehicle under the influence of Alcohol KRS 189A.010(1B)-1st offense (Aggravating Circumstances) and Wanton Endangerment 1st Degree KRS 508.060. On February 2, 2023 Detective Derrick Walton pled guilty to Operating a Motor Vehicle under the influence of Alcohol KRS 189A.010(1B) - 1st offense (Aggravating Circumstances) and Reckless Driving KRS 189.290.

If the above allegation is true, Detective Derrick Walton is in violation of General Order 1973-02K Disciplinary Procedures of Sworn Officers, Appendix B, Operational Rule 1.01 Adherence to Laws, Regulations and Orders which states: "Officers shall abide by all laws, ordinances, and regulations, of the United States, Commonwealth of Kentucky, and Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government."

Investigation

On October 30, 2022 at 1854 hours, Derrick Walton was involved in an at-fault collision in Scott County. Upon Georgetown Police's arrival, he was taken into custody on charges of Operating a Motor Vehicle under the influence of Alcohol KRS 189A.010(1B)-1st offense (Aggravating Circumstances) and Wanton Endangerment 1st Degree KRS 508.060. He was transported to the Scotty County Detention Center and provided a breath sample resulting in .203g/ per 210L of breath. The occupant of the other vehicle involved was transported to Georgetown Hospital for injuries to his head and hand.

On February 2, 2023 Derrick Walton pled guilty to Operating a Motor Vehicle under the influence of Alcohol KRS 189A.010 (1B) - 1st offense (Aggravating Circumstances) and Reckless Driving KRS 189.290. The Scott County Attorney's office advised that the operator of the other vehicle was treated for a concussion at the hospital the evening of the collision. Due to the minor nature of the injury, the charge of Wanton Endangerment 1st was amended to Reckless Driving by the County Att. Office.

As part of his guilty plea, Derrick Walton was sentenced to 15 days of home incarceration, the requirement of an ignition interlock device instillation on his personal vehicle, and completion of an addiction recovery program. Prior to sentencing, Walton had already

along with adherence to the ignition interlock procedures and maintenance resulted in the ability for Walton to have his license reinstated after a four (4) month period of suspension. The first week of May 2023 is the projected reinstatement date. A financial fine was also part of the final judgement.

Interview with Detective Derrick Walton

I interviewed Detective Walton on March 7, 2023 at 1305 hours in the Public Integrity Unit office. Lt. David Biroschik was also present for the interview along with FOP attorney Scott Crosbie.

Detective Walton stated the following:

Detective Walton stated that he was driving his personal vehicle on October 30th, 2022 after dropping his father off following a golf tournament. He advised that he had drank throughout the day, but did not believe at the time that he was too intoxicated to drive. As he drove on McClelland Circle at the bypass in Scott County, he entered the intersection at Paynes Depot Road as he believed the light changed to red. His foot slipped from the brake onto the accelerator in part due to the spiked golf shoes he was wearing, causing him to strike another vehicle from the rear that he believed turned right into the lane in front of him.

The collision report included a statement from the other driver involved that he was stopped in traffic on McClelland Circle at Paynes Depot waiting for the light to turn green. When the light turned green, he was struck from behind by Walton.

Detective Walton advised that Georgetown Police along with EMS responded to the scene, resulting in his eventual arrest for DUI and Wanton Endangerment 1st. Walton admits now that he was too intoxicated to drive that evening.

Detective Walton advised that he

The last time that he drank was when he entered his vehicle that day.

Detective Walton admitted that he without telling anyone, keeping it even from his closest co-workers and friends. At no point in the interview did

Detective Walton try to shift blame onto anyone else, or the department. He takes full responsibility for all circumstances that have brought him to this point. He stated that a component of his drinking was the pressure of the assignment he was in at the time (Personal Crimes Detective) and the idea that policing requires fearlessness and always getting the right answer led him to put pressure on himself.

I asked Detective Walton what the department could do to help him continue his progress in his career and personal life in the future. He indicated that the department could not do anymore for him than it has, and discussed how the department has been extremely supportive of him. He indicated that he would be proud to wear the uniform again if given the opportunity, and would like to be a resource for officers struggling with similar circumstances. After a year of sobriety he can attain a peer support certification

Detective Walton also asserted that he has the resources in place to help prevent a possible relapse or repeat of this incident, and

On March 9, 2023, he was involuntarily transferred from his position as a Personal Crimes Detective in the Bureau of Investigations to the Bureau of Patrol, but remains in an administrative assignment pending this investigation.

Conclusion

Detective Walton does not dispute any of the findings and takes full responsibility for his actions.

Detective Walton has

He did not wait for a court order to do so, he has been proactive in his actions to ensure that this kind of incident will not occur again. He was very vocal about his regret for how his actions could reflect on the department, and knows that these incidents can affect the public's opinion of the department, despite it having occurred off-duty.
