

One Lexington Hosts First Violence Disruption Training: On February 22<sup>nd</sup> One Lexington will be bringing in nationally renowned violence disrupter trainer, Dr. Eddie Woods out of Louisville, Kentucky to facilitate a violence disruption/conflict resolution training. Dr. Woods couples his real-life experience of growing up in the gang-influenced California neighborhood in the west end of Louisville, with his formal education, and over 30 years of experience in providing gun violence intervention services on the frontlines of some of Louisville's highest crime areas.

While we are all doing incredible work addressing gun violence holistically, I think this training can provide some cohesive language and best practices when it comes to mediation and violence disruption for those working in the streets, jails, or schools with our most vulnerable populations. We are all providing this service in our ways but I think this can bring some synergy to the work.

**Lexington receives a grant to establish a crisis team to join police on mental health calls:** Lexington has received an \$850,000 federal grant from the Kentucky Department for Medicaid Services to establish a crisis response team.

Governor Andy Beshear announced the grant this afternoon during his Team Kentucky update.

The application for the three-year grant was the collaborative effort of both the Lexington Fire and Police Departments. It will allow the city to hire a full-time mental health professional to respond directly to mental health calls in conjunction with the Lexington Police Department. This grant will also provide overtime funding for police officers who have taken specialized training in

responding to mental health emergencies, which currently includes approximately 45 officers.

"This is an enormous step forward in our ability to respond to mental health emergencies," Mayor Linda Gorton said. "It will make it possible for us to provide the most appropriate response to an individual in crisis and connect them to the best resource."

Money Smart for Small Business Classes are back: Commerce Lexington is excited to offer the Money Smart for Small Business Program developed jointly by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) and the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA). These classes provide an introduction to topics related to starting and managing a business. The series begins on Monday, February 5, and occurs every Monday for 6 weeks. A different business topic will be covered each week.

The Money Smart Program is taught by Dale Morgan, President and CEO of Foundation47, and offered at no cost to attendees.

**Exhilarating Inc. One Lexington Grant Report:** Transitioning into Adulthood Quarterly Report – March – December 2023

Number of participants Served – 29

Successful completion – 26

Exhilarating Inc. implemented four sessions of Transitioning into Adulthood during this time frame. The sessions were six weeks for 1 % hours. The ages range from 15-21. The gender breakdown was 14 females and 15 males. The race was African American -24 and Caucasian 5.

The program consists of workshops, field trips, and guest speakers. Workshops consist of work readiness, finding an apartment, financial literacy and budgeting, gun and youth violence, relationships, mental health juvenile vs. adult laws, and cooking.

All participants were assisted in getting missing documents (birth certificates, SS cards, photo ID). Bus passes were distributed to those in need. A light meal was served during each session. All individuals receive one-on-one coaching to deal with their situations.

All participants receive luggage, document organizer, and household items after completing the program.

All participants were offered one-on-one mental health coaching.

Funding spent: \$5,000.00 • Staff salaries /Consultant services - \$3,000.00 • Space - \$600.00 • Operating Expenses (birth certificates, photo id's, food, t-shirts, office supplies) - \$1,200.00 • Liability Insurance - \$200.00
