ONE Lexington Gun Violence Reduction Grant Application Is Now OPEN!

The ONE Lexington Gun Violence Reduction Grant opportunity for Fiscal Year 25 is open! This cycle will run from July 2024 through June 2025. The city of Lexington wants to build the capacity of community partners to stand up against gun violence by allocating \$100,000 to grassroots organizations on the front lines in the fight to make Lexington a safer place! This grant opportunity is for local grassroots/neighborhood organizations working with youth, ages 12-29, to prevent or address gun violence in Lexington-Fayette County.

Organizations funded in 2023 can apply but are not guaranteed continued funding through ONE Lexington. All ONE Lexington grant funding is contingent upon the city council's final approval of ONE Lexington's budget. The application will close on Wednesday, April 5th at 5:00 PM.

It Takes a Village In-School Mentoring Update

Each week, ONE Lexington and its community partners facilitate in-school mentoring groups for boys and girls, many affected by gun violence. We have 24 different groups in 15 schools, including the district's alternative programs. In the first couple of weeks of being back with our groups this semester, we've already mediated one conflict with the potential of turning into gun violence and connected a few families to wrap around services.



NOCAP Program Update

We also have a program called #NOCAP which provides free programming for youth with incarcerated parents or who have been directly affected by gun violence. The last couple of weeks we've had some young men in the recording studio as part of their diversion program. Giving them a space to express some of the trauma they've endured while helping them realize the impact of their voices.
