Youth Bill Passes Into Law: One Lexington Works Senate Bill Focused On Youth Employment:

The ONE Lexington team has guietly been working with Frankfort on Senate Bill 128 which will allow youth ages 12 & 13 to work limited hours and duties for vetted local nonprofits to earn income. Last week we were informed that the bill has officially been passed into law! We worked with Senator Givens (who is sponsoring this bill) and his team & nonpartisan Kentucky policy organizations, to make sure that there are safeguards in place (no more than 3 hours a day or 18 hours a week, cannot be performed during school hours, jobs cannot involve interstate commerce or production of goods, and much more) to provide opportunities but more importantly protect children. We want local organizations in our nonprofit ecosystem to be able to provide compensation for youth to perform duties within their mission. We believe this bill will not only incentivize leadership but will provide an opportunity for our most vulnerable young people to earn some income the right way, without it counting against the family's home income. This will also help them to develop workforce skills at a younger age. In the coming weeks, we will begin to communicate the importance of this bill to the community and how our community partners can utilize it to create more opportunities for our young people.

rising seniors of color at Bryan Station High School who will be attending in-state schools while pursuing Criminal Justice degrees! Here is a little background on the scholarship program: ONE Lexington is dedicated to reducing violence in all neighborhoods of our city. Investing in our youth and providing more equitable opportunities will make our communities safer! Galls, headquartered in Lexington, is Proud to Serve America's First Responder professionals, each year over one million First Responders trust us to provide their essential gear and supplies. Galls believes that Real Inclusion Starts with Empowerment and is Proud to partner with ONE Lexington to bring this scholarship opportunity to Bryan Station High School and believes in the potential of this program to spark continued growth between our customers and the communities they serve and live.

The scholarship will provide a maximum of \$10,000 for a single academic year. The award will be based on academic merit and achievements, such as leadership, excellence in arts or sports, and volunteer activities benefiting the community. This is a one-time scholarship designed to offset financial barriers for students looking to further their education.

2020 was a very challenging year for our country and our local community as we suffered a once-ina-lifetime global pandemic and endured social unrest in response to racism. One of the silver linings of those challenges was the racial disparities in many of our systems being highlighted, creating an opportunity for our country to make muchneeded change. African Americans and other persons of color disproportionately populate the prison system while having very little representation working in the criminal justice system. The lifechanging

opportunity will help a Bryan Station student **BE THE CHANGE** by making a difference from within.

<u>Community Conversation On Gun Violence In Tates</u> <u>Creek Area</u>

Last week, several neighbors welcomed our ONE Lexington team and an advocate from The Nest into their homes to discuss the recent spike in gun violence in the Tates Creek area. College students preparing for finals, an elderly couple dealing with health issues, and a young married couple with 4 small children, all talked about the traumatic experiences of bullets NOT MEANT FOR THEM, entering their homes. While dropping off some food shares from the local Lexington organization, Black Soil, we were able to connect folks to resources for property damage, mental health, faith communities, but most importantly just seeing how folks were doing. We also got some tips on when and where we can engage some young people in the area so that we can support and pour LIGHT into them. These neighborhood engagement efforts led by our Crisis Response Coordinator, Kenneth Payne, led us to create 2 upcoming opportunities for residents in the area to come out and speak about the concerns they have for their neighborhoods. We will be hosting community conversations for Gainesville area residents on May 1st and for Kirklevington area residents on May 8th. Information can be found on the fliers below! Uptick In Juvenile Girls Involved In Conflict

When you look at gun violence stats, in-school behavior referrals, and other youth activity centered around the conflict in Lexington, KY, it has historically and predominantly affected boys and young men. Unfortunately, One Lexington and its community partners have noticed an uptick in violent conflict over the last few years involving young girls. Already, in 2024 we have had two, 14-year-old girls. who have been shot, nonfatally. In the last 2 weeks, we have been made aware of 2 large incidents where multiple juvenile girls were fighting each other, with one of those incidents ending with shots being fired into the air. We are also seeing more incidents where girls and young women are the ones behind the trigger. Being a girl-dad myself, it especially breaks my heart to see so many girls involved in conflict, being victims of violence, and now many who are entering the cycle of gun violence themselves. I believe these latest trends highlight the importance of a continued holistic approach to looking at how we address gun violence in our communities. No neighborhood, no race, and no gender are exempt from this issue, therefore we must continue fighting these problems as a village. However, there also needs to be a more intentional focus on prevention when it comes to our young girls. So many of the programs and alternative opportunities over the years have been focused on boys. What does that intentional focus look like? Well, our team looks to begin looking at more data and talking with more community partners on how we can address this. In the short term, several schools are looking for women facilitators to come in and lead girls' mentoring groups.
