#### Conclusion of It Takes a Village In-School Mentoring Program:

Special thanks to the ONE Lexington It Takes A Village In-School Mentoring Collective (The Voyage Movement Bridging the Gap Prison Ministry!!, Tania Walker, Dawn Runyon, Rhema Word Foundation also known as Rhema Wings, and Andre Wilson) in collaboration with ONE Lexington and Fayette County Public Schools. We have facilitated 23 groups in 17 different schools this semester, with many of our mentees having experienced gun violence in their lives directly or indirectly. For end-of-the-year gifts, we got them t-shirts from SoulNRoses! Our collective had over 3,000 interactions with mentees during the 2023-2024 school year. Our model is to provide groups of students with in-school support each week, focusing on topics and discussions that teachers may not have the bandwidth to cover in the classroom regularly. Group topics could consist of things such as conflict resolution, financial literacy, breaking generational curses, career readiness, entrepreneurship, mental health, mindfulness, dating violence, diversity &inclusion, gun violence, and more. We allocated part of our budget to support these facilitators and reward the kids at the end of the semester. The facilitators share experiences and data with us so that we can better serve young people with the ultimate goal of keeping them out of the cycle of violence or helping disrupt that cycle if they are in it. The amazing thing is that our collective is just a small

part of a community-wide effort to provide that in-school support. Shouts to M.A.D.E., Operation Making A Change, Urban Impact Lexington, My Sister's Keeper, SWAG, and many others who are in the schools every week providing extra support to students. People ask what Lexington is doing that is making a difference. Well, this is it! Everyone is coming together and playing a role and we are honored to be a part of this community!







#### One Lexington Awards \$10,000 Be The Change Scholarships at Bryan Station High School:

In partnership with Galls of Lexington and Central Bank, ONE Lexington (Larry Lamont Johnson, Kenneth Payne) awarded the winners of our #BeTheChange scholarship program, \$10,000 college scholarships! This opportunity is for rising Bryan Station High School seniors of color who plan on attending an in-state school to pursue a criminal justice or related degree! Michelle Moore will pursue a career as a trauma nurse and Aline Sandavol Cano will pursue a career in criminal psychology, both enrolling at the University of Kentucky this fall! While we encourage them to continue using their voices and platforms to challenge the system, we also want them to BE the change and representation that they want to see in those systems.



We are grateful for Mayor Linda Gorton's continued support of this life-changing program for our students. 
